Happy Park and Recreation Month! I hope you're taking the time to explore our great parks, trails, and aquatic centers!

Since my last newsletter, the Board of Commissioners took action on several important items:

- Renewed a management agreement with Georgia Gwinnett College for operation and staffing of the Gwinnett Entrepreneur Center; 20 percent of funding comes from grants awarded by the US Department of Housing and Urban Development
- Reappointed Helen Ellis and Brandon Harris and appointed Brandon
 Seay to the Upper Ocmulgee River Resource Conservation and Development Council Inc.
- Approved an annual contract with View Point Health to provide mental health services through the Police Mental Health Collaboration program
- Approved the Sheriff to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with United Way of Greater
 Atlanta to provide homeless individuals released from the Gwinnett County jail with shelter,
 substance abuse treatment, job skills training, crime prevention education, and case management
 assistance as an overall collaborative effort to reduce recidivism
- Accepted \$2 million in grant funds awarded by the Federal Transit Administration under the 2023
 Community Project Funding Program for the Route 25 Bus Shelter Construction Project
- Entered into an intergovernmental agreement with the city of Lilburn for the Pleasant Hill Road at Burns Road intersection improvement project

OneStop Centerville expansion underway

Gwinnett officials recently broke ground on the expansion of OneStop Centerville. The expansion includes a 33,500-square-foot, two-story facility and 11,000-square-foot playground that will enhance access to services and resources for the southern Gwinnett community.

The new facility will house office space for County partners including GNR Health, View Point Health, and Ninth District

Opportunity Head Start. It will serve as a community hub for programs that support public health, early learning, mental health and family services. The project will be built using \$25 million of federal American Rescue Plan Act funding.



Board hosts public hearing on proposed 2023 millage rate

The third and final public hearing to share in-person comments the general fund millage rate will occur on **Tuesday**, **July 18 at 11:00am** at the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center. The proposed millage rate is 6.95 mills, the same as last year. County staff will be available for questions one hour before each public hearing. The Board of Commissioners will consider the millage rates during our meeting on the same day at 2:00pm.

Most property owners who benefit from the <u>Value Offset Exemption</u> won't see an increase in the county government portion of their property taxes. The <u>Homestead Tax Relief Grant</u>, approved by the governor and Georgia General Assembly, will provide additional tax savings for those with a homestead exemption.
