Hello!

The kids are back in school, and despite the warm temperatures, fall is just around the corner. Keep reading for ways to stay engaged in our vibrant community in the coming months.

Since my last newsletter, the Board of Commissioners took action on several important items:

- Authorized the application for a \$500,000 Land and Water Conservation Fund grant from the Georgia Department of Natural Resources, which will be used to replace playground equipment at Best Friend and Shorty Howell Parks; if awarded, the County's \$500,000 match will be funded by the 2023 SPLOST program
- Appointed Sharlene McLendon to the Region Three Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities Advisory Council and reappointed Tracie Moultrie to the Family and Children Services Board to serve as Board of Commissioners appointees
- Reappointed Dr. Tameka Womack to represent District 2 on the Gwinnett Animal Control Hearing Board
- Awarded a \$1.3 million contract for the Collins Hill Road Widening Project, funded by various SPLOST programs
- Accepted a \$2 million grant from the Atlanta Regional Commission to help fund senior services, including case management, congregate meals, home delivered meals, recreation, and personal and respite care
- Accepted 40 FIDO bags from The Fetch Foundation; each bag contains one O2 reusable pet mask, three reusable leashes, and water bowls to allow Fire and Emergency Services to help pets on emergency scenes
- Authorized the Chairwoman to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the Atlanta-Region Transit Link Authority for the Transit Facility Relocation Study
- Approved an Athletic Association Agreement with Seckinger Athletic Association, which will add more opportunities for young people to play sports like baseball, softball, football, cheerleading, and basketball

Microtransit coming to Snellville and Lawrenceville

Gwinnett is expanding its Ride Gwinnett service to include [microtransit](#), an on-demand service beginning August 28. Download the Ride Gwinnett app from the [Apple App](#) or [Google Play](#) stores to explore the new service. Riders will be able to request a shared-ride vehicle — typically a small van or shuttle — to travel to their destination within Snellville and Lawrenceville. This includes the Centerville area to the Shoppes at Webb Gin and Northside Hospital to Sugarloaf Parkway.

The service will provide additional mobility options and allow for better connectivity and accessibility to medical resources, education, and points of interest. It will also provide brand new connections to areas of the county that are not currently served by transit, which opens the service to new customers and increases the transit destination options for residents by 41 percent. Apply for a small business grant

Gwinnett County is helping small businesses impacted by COVID-19 find relief. The Board of Commissioners received \$181 million from the American Rescue Plan Act and allocated \$6 million of the funds to help small business owners.

If your business has experienced income loss or increased costs while continuing business during the pandemic, you might be eligible for this relief. Funds will be awarded based on the number of employees, gross revenue, total applicant COVID impact, and more. Applications will be available online Tuesday, September 5. Gwinnett receives \$20 million RAISE Award to transform Gwinnett Place Transit Center

We recently joined Congresswoman Lucy McBath, Senator Jon Ossoff, and U.S. Department of Transportation Assistant Secretary for Transportation Policy Christopher Coes to celebrate a \$20 million RAISE award granted to Gwinnett County.

With the award, the County will transform the existing Gwinnett Place Transit to include a two-story building that will house onsite customer service, an attached mobility building that will offer travel training and mobility assistance, 12 bus bays with amenities, and more. Gwinnett's Transit Development Plan identifies the site as a foundational investment that will allow the county to plan for continued growth and the expansion of current transit services.
