Since my last newsletter, the Board of Commissioners took action on several important items:

- Accepted \$2 million in grant funds from the federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration; the funds will be used over 5 years to expand substance use disorder treatment services in the Gwinnett County Adult Drug Treatment Court
- Awarded a contract for language learning and language skill assessment for County employees to enhance our workforce's ability to communicate with our diverse population
- Approved an application for \$200,000 in grant funding from the Georgia Department of Natural Resources to replace and add signage for the Gwinnett Trails system; if awarded, a County match of \$50,000 will be funded by the 2023 SPLOST program
- Retired K9 Elsa to her handler, Corporal A. Hylton
- Executed an agreement with the Georgia Department of Transportation for water relocations as part of the SR 316 at Cedars Road intersection modification project

Chairwoman Hendrickson proposes 2024 County budget

Chairwoman Nicole Love Hendrickson presented her<u>proposed</u> <u>budget</u> on Tuesday to guide County government spending for the 2024 fiscal year. The proposed budget for 2024 totals \$2.5 billion. It consists of a \$1.96 billion operating budget and a \$542 million capital improvements budget, which includes funds from the County's Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program. It addresses community needs like affordable housing and public

safety as well as challenges facing county government including hiring and retaining a qualified workforce.

We'll host a public hearing on Monday, December 4 at 6:30pm at the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center, and <u>residents can share their input on the County's website</u> through December 31. After hearing your input, the Board of Commissioners will consider the 2024 budget at our first meeting of the new year on January 2.

Learn about Ride Gwinnett's newest route Starting November 20, there will be a new way to connect to your favorite places! Ride Gwinnett <u>Route 50</u> will provide a connection from the Sugarloaf Mills Park and Ride through downtown Suwanee. It also includes connections to the Mall of Georgia, the Exchange at Gwinnett, and Coolray Field.

Get a grant toward your first home

Are you a first-time homebuyer? You might be eligible for Gwinnett's Homestretch Down Payment Assistance Program! New or existing Gwinnett residents aspiring to own a home can receive down payment assistance of up to \$7,500 as a five-year deferred payment loan with zero percent interest. To qualify, the home must be located within Gwinnett County and should not exceed \$323,000 for an existing home or \$346,000 for new construction.
