County opens warming stations on cold nights

Gwinnett County is activating five warming stations around the county for residents to receive temporary, overnight relief from long-term exposure to frigid temperatures of 35 degrees and below.


The warming stations are activated on evenings where temperatures are expected to drop to 35 degrees or below. Stations will be available from 6:00pm until 7:00am on these nights, and residents who visit the sites will be able to warm up, eat a meal, and get some rest. The County posts notices for evenings

Board approves agreement to fund Bus Rapid Transit cost study

The Board of Commissioners approved an agreement with three community improvement districts to fund a cost study of a Bus Rapid Transit corridor between Doraville and Sugarloaf Mills.

The agreement with the Gateway85, Gwinnett Place, and Sugarloaf CIDs outlines financial commitments and the management structure for a study to estimate the capital and operating costs for the Bus Rapid Transit corridor. Bus rapid transit, or BRT, is a bus-based transit system that may include dedicated lanes, traffic signal priority, off-board fare collection, elevated platforms and enhanced stations.

Each CID will contribute \$25,000 toward the cost of the study, which is estimated to cost \$100,000. The County will manage the study and provide the balance of funding from the 2017 Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax.

Finish the year strong with a COVID-19 vaccine and earn \$100

Learn about redistricting at one of my open house meetings

Under a decades old law, political boundaries must be drawn every decade to match a County's changing population. State legislators are charged with the task, which can also determine how people may vote. My open houses will be held:

Commissioners break ground on Eastern Regional Infrastructure project

Last month, we broke ground on the Eastern Regional Infrastructure project, which will bring water, sewer, and trails to 8,500 acres in eastern Gwinnett.

The Eastern Regional Infrastructure Project includes approximately five miles of new public trails, two trailheads, upgraded and expanded water service, and expanded sewer

service. The project will be funded by the departments of Water Resources and Community Services, including revenue from the 2017 SPLOST, which will fund the trails component of the project. Learn more about the project at GwinnettERI.com.

The 30 percent goal will be based on the total contract amount of all contracts with vendors and contractors involved with Rowen, a 2,000-acre knowledge community in eastern Gwinnett County, and is anticipated to continue across the life of the project.
