Celebrate Black History Month in Gwinnett

Celebrate Black History Month with Gwinnett! Join us Tuesday, February 21 at 6:30pm at the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center. Enjoy performances, soul food, and community. A Black History Month display will also be available for viewing in the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center atrium throughout February.

You can also pack a picnic lunch and explore the rich

history of African American culture in Gwinnett on a Black History Month Bus Tour from 10:00am to

2:00pm on Saturday, February 11. The tour departs from Lawrenceville Female Seminary, where a special Black History exhibit is also on view through the end of February. Both the tour and exhibit are presented by the Gwinnett History Museum in partnership with the United Ebony Society. The bus tour is \$11 per person; preregister by February 6.

Attend a transit expansion public meeting <u>Ride Gwinnett</u>, formally Gwinnett County Transit, is hitting the road with three new local routes and two microtransit zones. Residents are invited to learn about the new transit services and share their feedback during an <u>in-person or</u> <u>virtual meeting</u> from February 1 to March 7 at different locations around the county.

The three local transit routes will service new areas in Snellville, Stone Mountain, Buford, and Suwanee and provide extended coverage in Lawrenceville, Lilburn, and



Duluth. New service also includes microtransit, which will allow residents to request Ride Gwinnett from a mobile application and go to their destination within the zones of Snellville and Lawrenceville.



Gwinnett earns platinum-level sustainability certification

Gwinnett County continues to uphold its commitment to sustainability, earning recertification as a Green Community at the Platinum Level by the Atlanta Regional Commission. Developed in 2009, the <u>Green Communities Program</u> is a voluntary sustainability certification program that helps local governments implement measures that reduce their environmental impact through actionable measures.

The recertification recognizes Gwinnett's ongoing commitment to

environmental stewardship and leadership in sustainability practices for a stronger, greener community. Gwinnett first earned certification as a Green Community in 2010 and became the first county to be certified at the Platinum Level in 2018.
