# **Happening Around Gwinnett**

#### Board adopts millage rate for 2023

The Board of Commissioners adopted the same general fund millage rate as last year, 6.95 mills. Property taxes are based on millage rates set by county government, the schools and cities. One mill equals a dollar tax per thousand dollars of assessed property value. Most homeowners in Gwinnett benefit from the Value Offset Exemption, which means they will not see an increase in the county government portion of their tax bill. Before holding the vote, the commissioners took public comments at three public hearings and online. Details on



the <u>2023 millage rates</u> and additional information about<u>how property taxes are calculated</u> are available on the County's website.



#### New property maintenance ordinance in effect

Gwinnett Code Enforcement <u>will begin enforcing</u> the interior standards of the International Property Maintenance Code at residential rental properties. These new requirements were adopted by the Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners to help maintain a safe, livable, and healthy community.

Tenants can request an inspection by visiting <u>GwinnettZIP.com</u>, calling 770.513.5004, or emailing <u>CodeEnforcement@GwinnettCounty.com</u>. Once a

request is submitted, an inspection appointment will be scheduled. During the inspection, any code violations will be documented on a notice of violation. A Gwinnett Code Enforcement officer will then work with the property owner or manager to address all violations.

# Gwinnett receives \$20 million RAISE Award to transform Gwinnett Place Transit Center

County officials were recently joined by Congresswoman Lucy McBath, Senator Jon Ossoff, and U.S. Department of Transportation Assistant Secretary for Transportation Policy Christopher Coes to celebrate a \$20 million RAISE award granted to Gwinnett County.

With the award, the County will transform the existing Gwinnett Place Transit to include a two-story building that will house onsite customer service, an attached mobility building that will offer travel training and mobility assistance, 12 bus bays with amenities, and more. Gwinnett's Transit Development Plan identifies the site as a foundational investment that will allow the county to plan for continued growth and the expansion of current transit services.

#### **Gwinnett Police Training Center expansion opens**

Gwinnett County officials on Monday cut the ribbon for the expansion of the Gwinnett Police Training Center. The \$6.2 million expansion adds more than 23,000 square feet of training space, instructional space, and administrative office space to accommodate growth within the department and the population Gwinnett Police serves.

The new facility includes three additional classrooms with AV equipment, stadium seating and an electrical emergency backup generator; a 5,000-square-foot multipurpose room to allow for physical and defensive recruit training; expanded locker

rooms and a breakroom. The larger training center will offer more space for recruit training and free up room for more classes for veteran officers and civilian staff.
