Happening Around Gwinnett

Board of Commissioners adopts 2024 budget

Today, the Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners approved a \$2.53 billion budget for 2024 to fund County operations and projects for the year. This year's spending plan consists of a \$1.97 billion operating budget and a \$561 million capital improvements budget, which includes funds from the County's Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program.

Register to vote in the upcoming 2024 elections

With election season underway, it's crucial to **register to vote now**. Georgia residents wishing to register must be at least 18 years of age by Election Day, must be a U.S. citizen, and be a legal resident of their voting county. The deadline to register to vote in the March 12 Presidential Preference Primary is **Monday, February 12**. Test your home for radon

Is your home safe from dangerous levels of radon?**January is Radon Awareness Month** and is a great reminder to check. Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer in the U.S., causing over 21,000 deaths each year. This radioactive gas from the soil and groundwater can get into your home and the air you breathe, with high indoor levels leading to dire exposure risks.
