Policywise, our Board of Commissioners as a whole took actions on many important initiatives:

- Re-awarded a contract to provide non-emergency medical transportation of seniors
- Accepted a grant from the Georgia Trauma Care Network to reimburse Fire and Emergency Services for the purchase of two Lucas Chest Compression Systems
- Approved an agreement with the Atlanta Regional Commission to accept grant funds to assist the Police Department with the implementation of a Situational Awareness and Crime Response Center
- Awarded a contract for the Voter Registrations and Elections renovation project
- Approved the retirement of Police K-9 Largo from service
- Approved the appointment of Jorgia Northrup as Probate Court Associate Judge

Last but not least, I've made District 4 appointments to the Family and Children Services Board (Dr. James A. Taylor) and Gwinnett Animal Control Hearing Board (reappointed Peg Murray).

County commissioners recognized for academic achievement in lifelong

## learning academy

ACCG, Georgia's County Association, recently awarded District 2 Commissioner Ben Ku and District 4 Commissioner Marlene Fosque with certificates for successfully completing the core requirements in the Lifelong Learning Academy. The ACCG Lifelong Learning Academy core certification includes eight courses as well as a two-day Leadership Institute for a total of 66 hours of required courses, which the commissioners have completed within just six months of taking office in January. County officials who complete the core certification achieve the status of "Certified County Commissioner."

## HHS event offers low-cost immunizations and screenings

## Records units opening at three precincts

The Police Department Records Unit has reopened at three police precincts to make records readily available to residents. In the past, residents could only retrieve police records in person at Police Headquarters or online. Now, visitors may also obtain copies of police reports, accident reports, and criminal histories at one of the three police precincts. People can also start the application process for record restrictions. The units have opened at the West Precinct in Norcross, the South Precinct in Lilburn, and the Central Precinct in Duluth.

### **Corrections celebrates second welding class graduation**

The Department of Corrections recently held a graduation ceremony for the second class of a vocational welding program designed to equip inmates with an occupational skill to help them land good jobs upon release. The ceremony recognized the 16-week program's 14 graduates, who attend the class four days a week for six hours a day after completing their work detail. In class, students receive instruction that emphasizes basic skills, safety, and quality workmanship. Upon completion of the course, they'll earn certificates in Introduction to Welding, Oxy-Fuel Cutting, Gas Metal Arc Welding, and Flux Cored Arc Welding from Gwinnett Tech. Should they choose to return to school after their release, the credits earned during the course can transfer back to Gwinnett Tech as hours that can be used toward a diploma.
