It is a sad thing to admit, either by virtue of my Midwest upbringing, or the time in which I came through school, but I had never been exposed to the realities of the southern Black experience. In the past, I had always encouraged friends to seek out those who don't look like you, as a way of

building bridges to a more vibrant Gwinnett. Apply for a Homestead Exemption by April 1

Looking for a way to reduce your property tax bill? Apply for a homestead exemption. Owners who occupied their home as their primary residence on January 1 and apply by April 1 qualify for an exemption this year. The state's proposed Homeowner Tax Relief Grant could mean additional savings for owners with a homestead exemption in 2023.

District Attorney's office accepting applications for student mentorship program

The Gwinnett County District Attorney's Office is accepting applications for the 2023 Junior District Attorney and Investigator Mentorship Program. The program gives students the opportunity to gain hands-on knowledge and experience in the criminal justice system. The mentorship program explores roles of the courts, law enforcement, and corrections. Participants will also gain community service hours. Candidates must be between ages 15 and 18, attend a Gwinnett County public school, and be in good standing with their school and community. You may be eligible to file your taxes for free

Have you filed your taxes yet? Tax Day is **April 18**. United Way of Greater Atlanta is providing free tax preparation services through the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program in partnership with the IRS. Through VITA, taxes are prepared by IRS trained and certified volunteers for low-to-moderate income families and individuals making \$60,000 a year or less. Did You Know?

I recently had the chance to visit Gwinnett's E911 Center, and I learned some great information to pass along.

Have you ever dialed 911 by accident? Whatever you do, don't hang up! Stay on the line and let the dispatcher know it was an accident. If you don't, the dispatcher will proceed as if your call is an emergency and send a police officer out to check. Accidental calls tie up operators and take away vital resources from callers in need.

You can also download the What3Words app to help 911 dispatchers identify your location, even without an actual address. The free What3Words app gives each 3-meter square in the world a unique three-word address.

If someone is lost — especially in a park, around Lake Lanier, or in any other undeveloped natural area in the county — they can use the unique three words from the application to give dispatchers their exact location.
