Practice fireworks safety this holiday season

Every Independence Day, thousands of people — mostly children — are hurt while using fireworks. To avoid serious injuries, Gwinnett Fire and Emergency Services encourages residents to attend a professional show instead of using fireworks themselves. However, if you are going to use fireworks, follow these tips to celebrate safely:

- Buy fireworks only from a licensed vendor
- Read and follow fireworks directions carefully
- Keep a bucket of water or fire extinguisher handy
- Ignite fireworks on a flat, open surface away from buildings, vegetation, or combustible materials
- Light one device at a time using a lighter
- Keep fireworks away from children

SPLOST: The Gwinnett Environmental and Heritage Center gets an update

Since 2006, the Blue Planet Exhibit film has been one of the most popular attractions for school-aged children and residents, providing valuable lessons on the water cycle, habitats, constructive and destructive forces, and weather.

The film will receive an update to bring it up to date with current data and happenings around the county, like research initiatives at the Water Tower. The \$300,000 project is funded by the 2014 and 2017 SPLOST programs.





Rabid cats caught in District 4

Gwinnett advises caution regarding unusual animal behavior after two different rabid cat incidents in Dacula on Tuesday, May 30 and Buford on Saturday, June 10. Please take precaution by ensuring your pets are vaccinated against rabies. Unvaccinated dogs and cats exposed to a rabid animal must be strictly quarantined for four months and vaccinated one month prior to being released.

If exposed, inform your healthcare provider and contact the

Gwinnett County Health Department at 770.339.4260. Report and arrange pickup of the animal by calling Gwinnett Animal Welfare and Enforcement Bite Office at 770.339.3200 ext. 5576; after hours, call Dispatch non-emergency at 770.513.5700. Learn more about protecting your family from rabies.
