Last Tuesday, the Board of Commissioners approved a condensed transit plan. I appreciate the pared down list of transit projects that includes the shuttle to the Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International airport and the expansion of microtransit, a shared-ride service.

Now, I'm setting aside time to discuss the condensed transit plan. Please stay tuned in the coming months for several town hall style events to share your voice in support or opposition for a referendum on the ballot. The plan proposes a shift in the County's current mobility funding model to a one

percent dedicated sales tax. A Transit SPLOST aims to distribute financial responsibility more equitably among all residents, businesses, and visitors, alleviating the burden on Gwinnett's property owners. To review the plan, visit <u>GwinnettCounty.com/TDP</u>.

Board of Commissioners adopts 2024 budget

The Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners approved a \$2.53 billion budget to fund County operations and projects for the year. The approved budget consists of a \$1.97 billion operating budget and a \$561 million capital improvements budget, which includes funds from the County's Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program. Some key initiatives in the budget entail expanding microtransit zones, growing the Economic Development Division, installing a biosolids dryer at the F. Wayne Hill Water Resources Center, hiring 12 firefighters to staff

a new ambulance and alternative response vehicle, recruiting 12 new E-911 communications officers, and enhancing pay for elections poll officials. For more information, visit GwinnettCounty.com/2024Budget.

Braselton Highway to begin construction

Construction is underway to widen State Route 124/ Braselton Highway, expanding the road to four lanes with turn lanes, sidewalks, curb and gutter, and drainage improvements from Pine Road to Spout Springs Road. These improvements will enhance local transportation infrastructure, promote safety, and address traffic congestion.



The \$10.6 million project is funded largely by various SPLOST programs, with \$3 million coming from a Georgia Department of

Gwinnett adds 10 new glass recycling sites

Gwinnett Fire and Emergency Services is seeking volunteer chaplains for its chaplaincy program. Gwinnett County and Gwinnett Clean & Beautiful, in partnership with Ripple Glass, have added 10 new glass recycling locations across the county, including one at Bogan Park. The County's glass recycling program allows residents to drop off glass for safe and sustainable recycling.

With these new additions, Gwinnett provides a total of 13 glass recycling locations. The newest locations complement the existing three containers at One Stop Norcross, Pinckneyville Park in Norcross, and E.E. Robinson Park in Sugar Hill.

Register to vote in the upcoming elections

As the election season kicks in, it's important to register to vote now. To be eligible, Georgia residents need to be U.S. citizens, legal residents of their voting county, and at least 18 years of age by Election Day. The deadline to register to vote in the March 12 Presidential Preference Primary is Monday, February 12.
