County to break ground at Singleton Park on March 28

Commissioners gave the green light to build Singleton Park and Greenway in unincorporated Norcross. The new 1.58-acre park will meet the community's diverse needs and preferences with recreational and accessibility features, including open leisure spaces, a playground, a multimodal trail, shade structures, and a Ride Gwinnett stop. The \$6.3 million project is funded by the American Rescue Plan Act, a Governor's Office grant, 2017 SPLOST programs, and a CARES Act Community

Reduce your property tax bill by applying for a homestead exemption! Owners who occupied their home as their primary residence as of January 1 may qualify for an exemption this year.
