




Safe & Healthy Community



Bay Creek Police Precinct and Alternate E911 Center

- 12,117 sq. ft. facility
- Ribbon cutting Dec 3
- \$15.9 million project, funded by 2009, 2014, and 2017 SPLOST funds

Fire Apparatus Replacements

- Gwinnett Fire & Emergency Services vehicle replacements
- Funded by 2014 SPLOST:
- Fire engine replacements: \$13.24 million to date
- Ambulance replacements: \$2.37 million to date

Implementing Gwinnett Trails Master Plan:

- Greenway planning, acquisition, development
- Harris Trail Greenway
 - Trailhead at Tribble Mill Park/ Archer High School complete
- Ivy Creek Greenway
 - 2 completed sections within scenic corridors
- 2009 and 2017 SPLOST Funding: Approx. \$16 million allocated

Gwinnett Justice & Administration Center Expansion:

- Courthouse Addition
 - Larger jury assembly room
 - Additional courtrooms
 - Security entrance
 - Pedestrian walkways
- Parking Deck: 1,500 spaces
- Funded by SPLOST 2009: approx.\$75 million project





Livability & Comfort

Club Drive Park - Phase II

- Built on 2.3 acres:
 - Half-acre lawn space
 - Paved walking loop
 - Swing sets
 - Picnic shelter with tables
 - Overlook deck with seating
 - 35-space parking lot
 - Will serve as trailhead for future greenway along Sweetwater Creek
- Funded by 2014 SPLOST



Strong & Vibrant Local Economy

Infinite Energy Center Expansion & Renovation

- Renovation of ballrooms, meeting space, and performing arts center
- 50,000 sq. ft. expansion of exhibit hall space; additional special event and meeting rooms
- Roof replacement
- Funded by 2017 SPLOST
















Tanner Road Improvements


- The City of Dacula is nearing completion of this project
- The 1.3-mile project is the largest road project to date for the City
- Focused on improving safety and infrastructure





Tanner Road Improvements

- Milling, repaving, and striping the road
- Widening Tanner Road from Harbins Road to Franklin Drive
- Replacing drainage ditches with storm pipes as needed
- Replacing existing storm pipes as needed
- Grassing all disturbed areas with sod






Tanner Road Improvements

Improved pedestrian safety:

- Installing 5-foot sidewalks and curb & gutter on the north side
- Installing handrails as needed
- · Crosswalk at east side






City of Duluth - 2009 SPLOST Program







SR 120 Sidewalk: Buford Hwy to Claiborne Drive

- Jointly funded City and County project
- 1.2 miles sidewalk from Buford Highway to Claiborne Drive
- 12 months construction: completed August 2019
- Total project cost: \$1.4M
- Part of overall downtown sidewalk connectivity plan





Rogers Bridge Rehabilitation

- 80% Federal grant; 20% local match
- Replica truss to replace the existing structure
- In final design phase, with construction in fall of 2020
- 15-18 months construction, with expected completion mid 2022
- Overall cost estimate: \$6.7M












- Connects Historic Downtown to Georgia Gwinnett College
- Linear Park with Multi-Use Trails
- Depot area Redevelopment
- Total Project Budget: \$31.5M
 - \$13.4M SPLOST
 - \$18.1M City

- Phase 2: Demolition Complete

- Grand Opening Dec. 2020







Lilburn Police Headquarters and Court Complex





- 2017 SPLOST Public Safety Fund
- The new building will be more centrally located and more visible
- Relocation allows for continued downtown revitalization

Lilburn Police Headquarters and Court Complex





- Under construction
- Scheduled to be completed in early 2020



Lilburn City Park Restrooms Facility

- 2017 SPLOST Recreation / Capital Projects Fund
- 2,000+ square foot building to accommodate larger events and daily park users
- Twenty-five stalls, two ADA compliant restrooms, two family restrooms, and a storage area
- Completed in September 2019








Destination Park

- Land was purchased through an IGA with Gwinnett County using SPLOST money in 2001.
- Four years later, SPLOST funds were used to purchase playground equipment.
- Now SPLOST funds will be used for improvements as well as the installation of bathrooms in Loganville's busiest park.





Sidewalks




- SPLOST funds have been the cornerstone of improving walkability around western Loganville.
- Including use of funding from the current SPLOST, 5 neighborhoods will be connected to each other and Destination Park.

Norcross Veterans Park

- Tribute to the sacrifices made for our freedom
- Added small monuments to each branch of the armed services
- Includes walking paths, accessible parking, decorative landscaping, and small grass area for gathering.







Norcross Veterans Park


- Maintained the city's Net Zero Tree Policy.
- Project funded through SPLOST and donations from citizens.



Norcross Pinnacle Park



- Completed
- Twelve acres of green space as well as a connection to the Beaver Ruin Creek Greenway and the Gwinnett County-wide Trail System.





Pinnacle Park (cont'd)

 During construction, the city famously contracted fortyone goats and two "protector" sheep dogs for five weeks from Get Your Goat Rentals

Goats cleared the overgrown vegetation around the property







Pinnacle Park (cont'd)

- Brings to life a long-held vision for the city to provide underserved areas of the community equal access to parks and green space.
- Incorporates innovative development practices to subscribe to ARC's Platinum Green Community guidelines; an embodiment of Norcross' commitment to sustainability.
















Administrative Facilities



- \$6.5 million (\$2.3M SPLOST + \$4.2M URA bond)
- Municipal Court renovation/addition design & permitting completed June 2019
- Construction underway spring 2020 completion







Buford Highway Reconstruction
