- Enforcement





6¢ Sales Tax in Gwinnett County




All SPLOST Programs - \$2.4 Billion

Gwinnett's SPLOST Programs



- 1985 \$65.7 million (\$2.7 million/month)
 - Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center
- 1988 \$162.7 million (\$3.4 million/month)
 - Public Safety (Pre-Trial Detention Center)
 - Parks and Recreation (Historic Courthouse Renovation)
 - Gwinnett Civic Center
 - Transportation



SPLOST Gwinnett's SPLOST Programs



1992 - \$249.1 million (\$5.2 million/month)

1996 – SPLOST vote failed (49.5% in favor)

1997 - \$414.8 million (\$8.6 million/month)




Overview of 2005 and 2009 SPLOST Programs






Gwinnett SPLOST Collections




Funds Distribution

2005 Program \$581,460,528








2005 SPLOST Distribution by City













- For the 2005 SPLOST Program, the City of Dacula allocated their funds as follows:
 - 91.0% Roads, Streets and Bridges
 - 9.0% Recreational Facilities
- For the 2009 SPLOST Program, the funds are allocated as follows:
 - 54.7% Roads, Streets and Bridges
 - 1.2% Public Safety Facilities and Equipment
 - 4.1% Recreational Facilities
 - 34.9% Administrative Facilities
 - 5.1% Water & Sewer Capital Improvements





- For the 2005 SPLOST Program, the City of Berkeley Lake allocated their funds as follows:
 - 39.7% Roads, Streets and Bridges
 - 24.1% Recreational Facilities
 - 36.2% Administrative Facilities
- For the 2009 SPLOST Program, the funds are allocated as follows:
 - 60.0% Roads, Streets and Bridges
 - 40.0% Administrative Facilities
