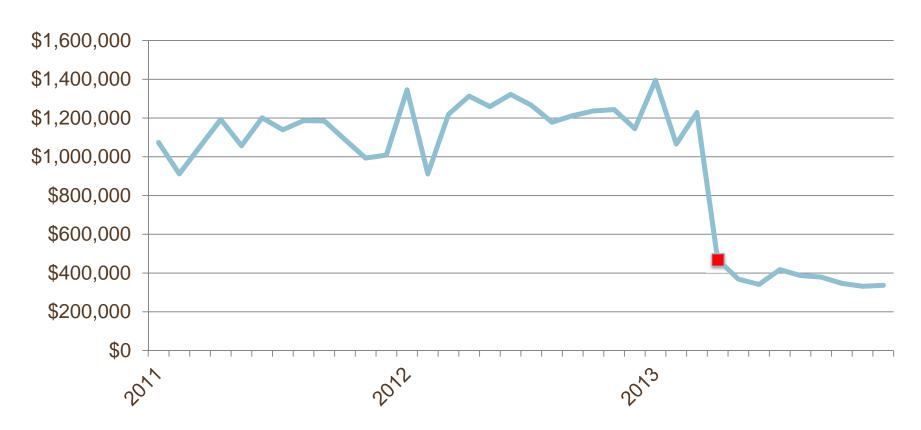


Gwinnett SPLOST Collections

Automotive Collections – January 2011 – December 2013; not seasonally adjusted







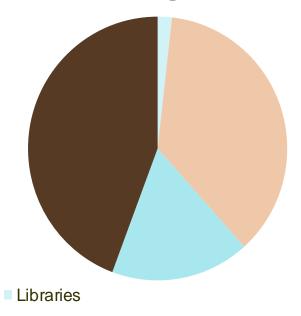

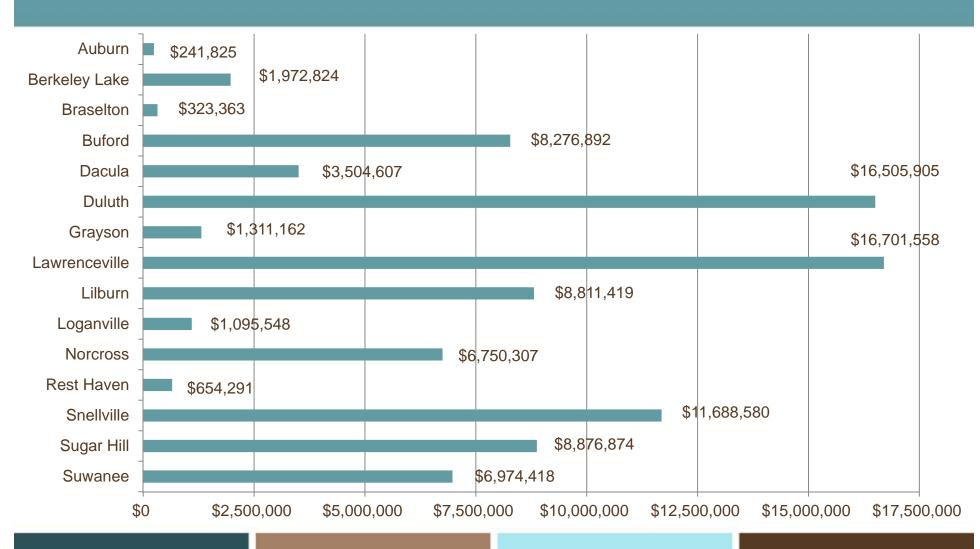

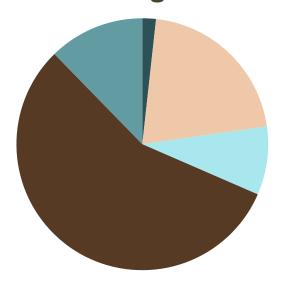

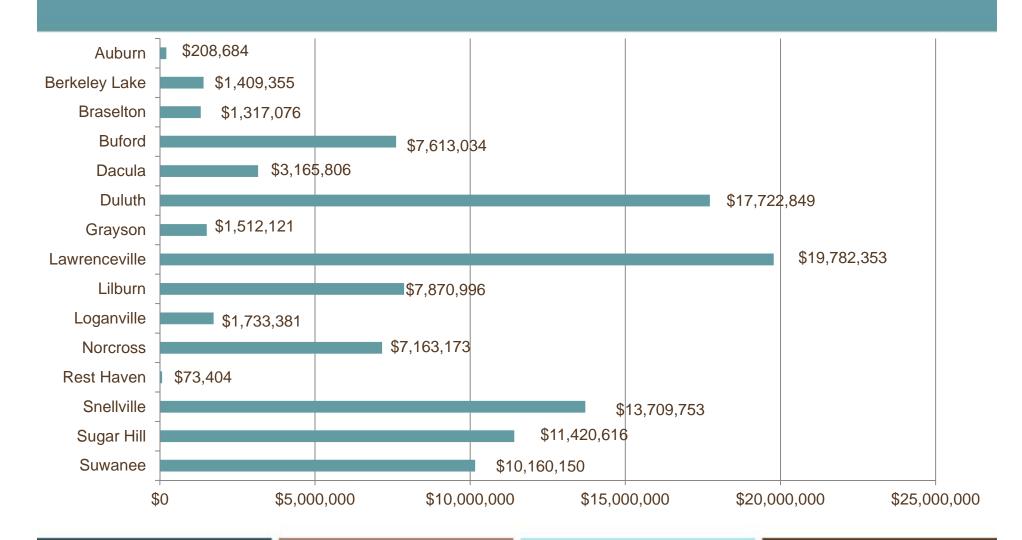

Lawrenceville

2009 SPLOST Heritage Trail 1

- Starts at GJAC War Memorial and runs to Rhodes Jordan Park
- Features red brick inlay with decorative lamp posts and medallions commemorating significant contributors to City history
- STATUS: Under Construction to be completed in April 2014

Total Project Budget: \$1,278,835 \$678,835 (TE) \$600,000 (SPLOST)

2009 SPLOST Heritage Trail 2

- Starts at Rhodes Jordan Park and runs down Paper Mill Trail
- Features red brick inlay with decorative lamp posts and medallions commemorating significant contributors to City history
- STATUS: In Engineering/Project to be awarded within 30 days

Total Project Budget: \$1,278,835 \$678,835 (TE) \$600,000 (SPLOST)

- 2.2 Mile Linear Park with Multi-Use Trails and Turnabouts
- Connects the Historic Downtown to Georgia Gwinnett College's Campus
- STATUS: Study Complete/In Survey and Design Phase
