





#### 2014 SPLOST Program Highlights

- Gwinnett County and 16 cities approved intergovernmental agreement in August
- 3-year program will raise estimated \$498 million
- Current SPLOST ends March 31, 2014







#### **Auburn**

Auburn has spent 100% of its 2005 SPLOST program allocation.

A portion of the 2009 SPLOST program funds has been spent toward:

- Road repairs
- Road repair equipment
- Stormwater drainage and guardrail improvements

#### **Braselton**

Braselton allocated 100% of its 2005 SPLOST program funds for Roads, Streets, and Bridges.

#### **Completed Projects**

- Thompson Mill Road Multi-Use Path
- Repaving the Grand Hickory roundabout

Braselton allocated its 2009 SPLOST program funds as follows:

- 60% for Roads, Streets, and Bridges
- 40% for Water and Sewer Capital Improvement
