Volunteer Gwinnett <u>reached new heights in 2022</u> with many thanks to you – our volunteers! A few highlights include:

Gwinnett Serves

Following its launch last April, <u>Gwinnett Serves</u> hosted 33 volunteer programs in 2022 to meet the needs of our nonprofit, civic, and religious community partners in Gwinnett. This included our epic Gwinnett Great Days of Service weekend in October, with 23 impact projects, 12 participating Gwinnett County Public Schools, and 976 volunteer service hours!

Innovative Programs

Volunteer Gwinnett received the National Association of Volunteer Programs in Local Government's <u>Innovative Program Award</u> for the Mobile Food Distribution Program, where 519,506 pounds of produce and shelf-stable food items were received by 21,724 households and 88,868 residents through volunteer and community partner efforts.

Volunteer Gwinnett at Your Service

Thanks to the volunteers, local communities, and government efforts, more than 782,309 volunteer hours were donated back to serving the community in 2022! Advocating for the youth

Volunteers from Gwinnett Court Appointed Special Advocate,

known as Gwinnett CASA, spent a special day at the Georgia State Capital on Thursday, February 2, to meet with state lawmakers during the 2023 Legislative Session to show the power of CASA's advocacy and stress the needs of the child welfare system.

Gwinnett CASA are screened and trained community volunteers appointed by a judge to advocate for the best interests of a neglected or abused child involved in juvenile court proceedings. With Gwinnett targeted as a critical high-need area by Georgia Court Appointed Special Advocates for Children in 2024, our Gwinnett CASA volunteers are working hard to serve the children in foster care and community.
