

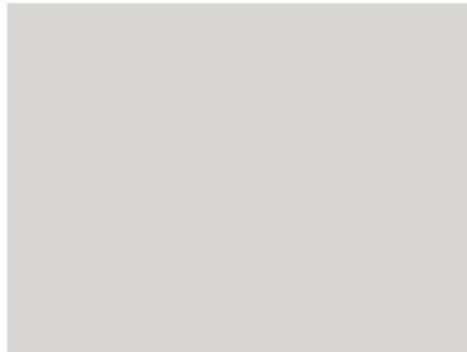

Automation

- In 2015, \$10,125,970 total fines and fees sent to the county finance department
- Of the \$7,057,102 fines and fees available to pay online, \$4,818,312 was collected
- 68% of our pay or appear citations are paid online

Automation

- Completely automated, real time, no data entry
- Recalls bench warrant and FTA
- Disposition sent to driving history
- Automatically receipts money to case
- Closes case

Automation

- Reduced phone and courthouse traffic
- Reduced errors
- Reduced credit card fees
- Available phone center

Open every day of the year except Thanksgiving and Christmas

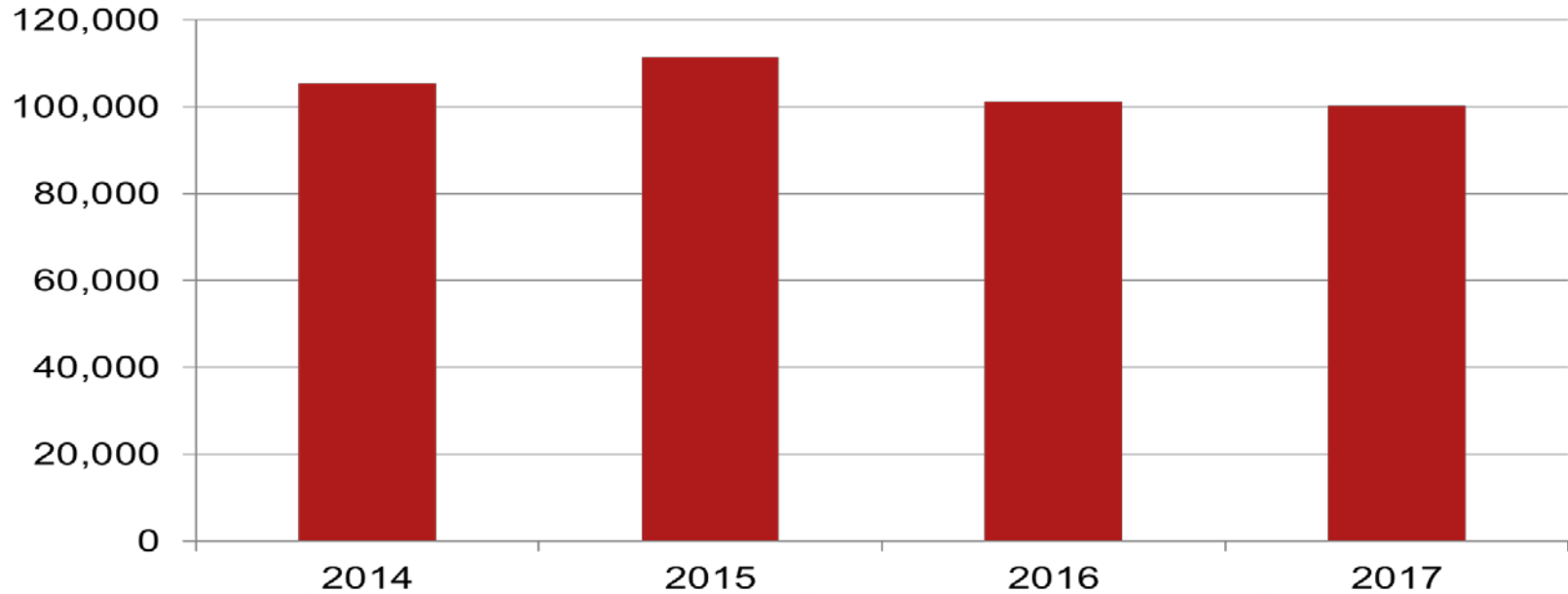
2016 Highlights
