Elections season offers many chances for Gwinnett voters to cast ballots



Gwinnett voters should make note of the many opportunities to exercise their civic duty. Voters can check their voter registration status on My Voter Page at [mvp.sos.ga.gov](#). They can also see a sample ballot and find their Election Day voting location.

This year, the Voter Registrations and Elections office is offering more voting opportunities than ever before. Eligible voters may **vote advance in person** every day, including weekends, **March 2 to March 20** at the Voter Registrations and Elections Office located at 455 Grayson Highway in Lawrenceville from 7:00am to 7:00pm. In addition, **satellite voting** will begin **March 9** until **March 20** from 7:00am to 7:00pm every day including weekends at seven additional locations around the county. Voters may request an **absentee/advance by mail ballot** for the March 24 Presidential Preference Primary **now** through **Friday, March 20**. Please call the Elections Office at 678.226.7210 to request an

application or complete the form online at GwinnettElections.com.

Además, la votación por satélite comenzará el **9 de Marzo** hasta el **20 de Marzo** de 7:00am a 7:00pm. Todos los días, incluidos los fines de semana en siete ubicaciones adicionales en todo el condado. Para lugares de votación por satélite, visite GwinnettElections.com.

Gwinnett Recorder's Court offering evening sessions



To better accommodate residents' schedules, Gwinnett Recorder's Court will offer evening court sessions beginning in March.

The nighttime sessions will be held at the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center once a month at 6:00pm on the third Thursday of each month beginning **March 26**. The sessions will be limited to minor traffic infractions. The number of sessions and the docket could expand depending on community response.

Participate in the 2020 Census

Invitations to participate in the 2020 Census will arrive by mail **inmid-March!** Most areas will receive an invitation to respond online (or by phone), while the other households will receive a paper questionnaire along with an invitation to respond online. Regardless of which invitation you receive, all households that have not yet responded will receive a paper questionnaire by mid-April.



As the invites arrive, remember that the Census Bureau will never ask for your Social Security number, your bank account or credit card numbers, or money or donations. The Census Bureau will not contact you on behalf of a political party. [Learn more](#) from the U.S. Census Bureau about avoiding fraud and scams.

Apply now to save on property taxes



If you own and occupy a home in Gwinnett County, you are likely eligible for a homestead exemption to reduce your property taxes. In addition to a standard exemption, there are several others for residents who are seniors, disabled, and other special circumstances. If you already have an exemption, you don't need to reapply. Here's how to get started:

- **Apply by April 1.** Exemptions are not automatic. Applications must be received by April 1 to reduce taxes in the current year.
- **Apply online** at [GwinnettTaxCommissioner.com/Exemptions](https://www.gwinnetntaxcommissioner.com/exemptions). Watch for an email confirmation. If you do not receive this email, contact us.
