

Earth Day Celebration returns to Coolray Field April 18

Please join the Solid Waste and Recovered Materials Division



on Saturday, April 18, 2015, at Coolray Field, home of the Gwinnett Braves as we celebrate Earth Day with a free recycling event.

This event will feature paper shredding (limit five copier paper boxes), electronics recycling (\$10 cash fee per TV), tire recycling (limit eight tires per vehicle; no dealer tires), paint collection (limit five one-gallon cans per vehicle; cans must

contain 25 percent wet, usable paint; no paint thinners, stains, spackle, oil paint cans, rusted paint cans, or dried-up paint), and toner/printer cartridge collection. Please bring your gently used or old sneakers to be donated to those in need or recycled into surfaces for local playgrounds and running tracks.

Kids will enjoy free activities like touch-a-truck, and adults will have the opportunity to meet their haulers. If you would like to volunteer, please visit www.volunteergwinnett.net to sign up for this event.

Animal Shelter closed until further notice for voluntary quarantine

On April 10, 2015, the Gwinnett County Animal Welfare and Enforcement Center voluntarily closed for quarantine due to an outbreak of illness in sheltered dogs. Symptoms were pneumonia-like and included coughing and sneezing. One dog died as an apparent result of the illness. Currently, a total of 23 dogs at the shelter are experiencing symptoms, but are responding well to antibiotic treatment with doxycycline.



The University of Georgia's College of Veterinary Medicine has been working to determine the cause of the outbreak. Testing is currently underway on four affected dogs. Partial results for one dog have come back negative for Bordetella, more commonly known as kennel cough. The dog also tested negative for all strains of canine influenza. Testing did indicate signs of pneumonia, for which the cause is unknown and under further study. The center is waiting on lab cultures to determine the original cause of the pneumonia. There is no current timeframe on the final results. As soon as they are received, the Gwinnett County Animal Welfare and Enforcement Center will issue another update.

The shelter will remain closed until further notice as all animals inside are still undergoing treatment. A long-term secondary shelter has been secured and will be open to the public soon. All routine shelter operations will be available in the secondary facility. This includes any owner reclaims and adoptions of animals that entered shelter care after April 10, 2015.
