Last day for advance/absentee voting: May 16

Registered voters have until Friday, May 16 to vote in advance or request an absentee ballot for the May 20 General Primary/Nonpartisan Election.

Voters may cast their ballots at the Gwinnett County Elections Office, 455 Grayson Highway in Lawrenceville from 8:00am to 5:00pm. Voters can also request an absentee ballot for the election. A completed



application must first be received before an absentee ballot is issued. Please call the Voter Registrations and Elections division at 678.226.7210 to request an application or [complete the form online](#).

Please note that **no voting will take place Monday, May 19**. If you do not vote advanced or absentee, you must cast your ballot on election day in-person at your voting precinct.
