

Greetings!

Gwinnett County Government is monitoring developments in the spread of the coronavirus outbreak and how it may affect our residents, employees, and our delivery of important County services.

We are following the most up-to-date guidance from the Gwinnett-Newton-Rockdale County Health Departments, the state Department of Public Health, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. As the COVID-19 pandemic [impacts County services](#) in different ways, residents and business owners are encouraged to take advantage of the many [online services](#) provided by the County.

Remember to take preventive actions to prevent the spread of respiratory disease, including putting at least six feet of distance between yourself and others when in public, [wearing a cloth face covering](#) as much as possible, avoiding contact with people who are sick, practicing [coughing and sneezing etiquette](#), avoiding touching your eyes, nose, and mouth, [washing your hands thoroughly and regularly](#), and disinfecting frequently touched objects and surfaces with a regular household cleaning spray or wipe. Gwinnett offering federal grants, loans for struggling local businesses



Gwinnett County is offering \$20 million in federal CARES Act loans and grants under the [Gwinnett Small Business Assistance Program](#) for local for-profit businesses that have been hurt during the COVID-19 pandemic. The funds are intended to help businesses reopen their doors with such needs as deep cleaning facilities, modifying facilities to accommodate ongoing social distancing, restocking inventory, marketing to their clients, and/or paying staff in advance of reopening and achieving revenue.

Applications for the funds will be available **June 30**. Grants are capped at \$75,000. The loans will range from \$50,000 to \$200,000. For eligibility, application requirements, and more, visit the [Small Business](#)

Don't miss the opportunity to support local farmers by purchasing fresh produce and other food items! The Georgia Grown To Go drive-thru farmer's market is back **June 25** from 3:00pm to 7:00pm at Coolray Field. The event is rain or shine and while supplies last.

Georgia Grown, an initiative of the Georgia Department of Agriculture, is partnering with Gwinnett County Government, Live Healthy Gwinnett, the Gwinnett Strippers, and Explore Gwinnett to host the event. Pre-order boxes for a reduced rate [online](#) until

5:00pm Wednesday, June 24. The box will contain new items including cantaloupe, eggplant, jalapenos, zucchini, yellow squash, bell peppers, Vidalia onions, and cucumbers. Other items available for pre-order and onsite purchase include watermelons and boxes of beef, chicken, sweet corn, peaches, mushrooms, and Vidalia onions. Orders will be available for contactless pickup at the event site, and a limited supply of items will be available for same day purchase on a first-come, first-served basis.

Clerk of Court criminal case electronic filing available

The Gwinnett County Clerk of Superior and State Courts announced the commencement of e-filing for criminal cases beginning June 24, via Tyler Technologies' Odyssey eFileGA. Attorneys and self-represented parties will have the option to electronically file into existing criminal cases. Criminal e-filing is another step forward in the Court's efforts to become a paperless environment. E-filing systems allow attorneys and self-represented parties to file the vast majority of pleadings, appeals, and other documents from any place that they can access the internet and at any time of day.
