

Gwinnett County Government will honor Gwinnett's veterans with a virtual Veterans Day ceremony on November 11 beginning at 11:00am. Tune in for remarks from County commissioners and other dignitaries, traditional honor guard activities, and a key note speech from Col. Richard H. White, a Norcross native and Vietnam veteran.

This year's ceremony will be combined with a salute to the flag to celebrate Flag Day. The Flag Day ceremony originally scheduled for June 2020 was canceled due to the pandemic.

Take part in America Recycles Day!

Recycle your electronics, latex paint, and paper at America Recycles Day on November 14 from 9:00am to 2:00pm at Coolray Field in Lawrenceville. Paper shredding is limited to five copier paper boxes. Only latex paint will be accepted and is limited to 10 gallons. Electronics recycling is free except for TVs and monitors, which cost \$15, and printers, which cost \$5, cash only.



Attendees should wear masks, remain in vehicles, and place recyclables in the back of vehicles or trunks for vendors to remove. Containers will not be returned. Gwinnett Animal Welfare recognized for save rate, work with other agencies



Gwinnett Animal Welfare and Enforcement last month received a Lifesaving Award for Collective Impact from Best Friends Animal Society, a national no-kill animal welfare organization.

Best Friends Animal Society honored Gwinnett Animal Welfare and Enforcement for its work with other organizations and its high save rate. The County saved about 96 percent of the animals in its care last year. The team at Animal Welfare has assisted other local shelters with best practices, grown its rescue and foster family

partners programs, increased education and outreach efforts, hosted vaccination clinics, and recently hired an animal behaviorist.
