Proposed 2015 budget still available for comment



Gwinnett Commission Chairman Charlotte Nash formally presented a proposed \$1.42 billion budget for fiscal year 2015 to the Board of Commissioners during a [briefing](#) on November 18, 2014. Four county residents and business people served on Nash's budget review committee. After hearing presentations from elected officials and department directors in September, the group studied departmental business plans, budget needs, and revenue projections to make recommendations for the 2015 budget. Commissioners held a public hearing on Monday, December 8, 2014. Written comments are still welcome through an online [comment form](#) through Wednesday, December 31, 2014. The Board expects to adopt the 2015 budget on Tuesday, January 6, 2015.

County offices closed for Christmas, New Year's

All Gwinnett County government offices, with the exception of those operations required for the comfort and safety of residents, will be closed December 24-25 for the Christmas holiday and reopen on December 26. Offices will also be closed January 1, 2015, for the New Year's holiday and reopen January 2, 2015. A Magistrate Court judge will be available at the Gwinnett County Detention Center during the Christmas and New Year's holidays.

Christmas Day and New Year's Day are trash and recycling holidays in unincorporated Gwinnett County. If your normal collection day takes place on one of these holidays, your collection will be delayed. Please visit www.sustainablegwinnett.com to view the detailed delay schedule.
