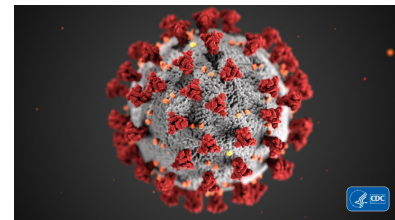

All Georgians 16 and older now eligible for COVID-19 vaccine

All Georgians 16 and older are now eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccine! COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective at protecting you from getting sick.

Based on what we know about COVID-19 vaccines, people who have been fully vaccinated can start to do some things that they had stopped doing because of the pandemic. The CDC says that [fully vaccinated people](#) can visit other vaccinated people indoors without masks, so you'll be able to safely hug Mom soon! After you've been fully vaccinated against COVID-19, continue precautions in public places, including wearing a mask, staying 6 feet from others, and avoiding crowds and poorly ventilated spaces. Gwinnett County announces extension of Emergency Rental Assistance Program set for April

The Board of Commissioners announced that the County will use more than \$28.1 million in stimulus funds from the federal Emergency Rental Assistance Program to launch an extension of its Project RESET eviction prevention program. This extension offers up to 15



months of total assistance, which may include rental and/or utility arrears (up to 12 months) and future rental and/or utility assistance if needed. Applications for this program will open in late April. Payments will be made directly to landlords and utility providers for past-due balances.

Gwinnett launches early learning and literacy program



Gwinnett County has partnered with Gwinnett County Public Schools and the Building Babies' Brains initiative to launch an early learning and literacy program called Building Brains (B²) Anywhere.

B² Anywhere provides mobile early learning programs across Gwinnett, including parks, childcare facilities, community centers, apartment complexes, places of worship, and more. Programs include a focus on literacy, STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and math), and nature play. They also provide

helpful suggestions to prepare children to thrive in kindergarten.

Expect your annual notice of assessment from Tax Assessor's Office

Most Residential and Commercial Annual Notices of Assessment for 2021 will be mailed on April 23. An Annual Notice of Assessment is not a tax bill. The notice informs you of the value assessed on your residential or commercial real estate as of January 1, 2021. Property owners may appeal the assessed value within 45 days of the date of the notice by submitting a completed PT311A state appeal form to the Tax Assessor's Office or visiting [Gwinnett-Assessor.com](https://www.gwinnett-assessor.com).
