Chairman Nash delivers 2018 State of the County Address


Almost 200 years of Gwinnett County history provided the backdrop for Board of Commissioners Chairman Charlotte Nash's 2018 State of the County speech February 14 to a crowd of about 800 at the Infinite Energy Center.

"Two hundred years after our founding, we remain a community of pioneers, with many of our residents having come from across the U.S. and from around the globe, seeking opportunity and

prosperity," she said.

With a projected population of more than 1.5 million in 2040, Nash said expanded transportation options must include transit. She said she hopes the state legislature will pass a bill that balances regional oversight and local control.

County offices closed for Presidents Day holiday on February 19



All Gwinnett County government offices, with the exception of those operations required for the comfort and safety of residents, will be closed February 19 for the Presidents Day holiday. County offices will resume normal business hours on February 20. A Magistrate Court judge will be available at the Gwinnett County Detention Center during the holiday.

Presidents Day is not a trash and recycling holiday for solid waste providers in unincorporated Gwinnett County, so trash and recycling collections are scheduled as normal. The Gwinnett County Solid Waste Management Call Center will be closed that day, but hauler call centers will be open. Residents can visit www.GCSolidWaste.com to find their hauler's contact information. Residents

who live in a city should contact their city to find out if trash and recycling will be delayed due to the holiday.

Medical Reserve Corps to host training on traffic and crowd control

Gwinnett Tax Commissioner announces new after-hours self-service kiosks for tag renewal



The Tax Commissioner's Office is offering two new self-service kiosks for citizens to renew their tags nights and weekends in Lawrenceville and in Buford. Customers will be able to renew their vehicle registrations and immediately receive current decals for their license plates. Major credit and debit cards are accepted, and processing fees apply.

The kiosk in the entrance foyer at the North Gwinnett tag office is available 24/7. The kiosk in Lawrenceville is available from 7:00am to

7:00pm Monday through Friday, and from 8:00am to 7:00pm on Saturdays.

Enroll in Gwinnett 101 to learn how government really works

How does the County put together a \$1.7 billion budget? Why do fire trucks respond to medical emergencies? How do they decide where to put traffic signals? The answer to these questions can be found at Gwinnett 101 Citizens Academy.

Gwinnett 101 Citizens Academy is a free,12-week program that gives participants a behind-the-scenes look at County government. The Citizens Academy is accepting applications for the spring session. For one evening a week from 6:00pm to 9:00pm, participants meet with County leaders, visit County facilities, and learn how government works.



Interested candidates must be at least 18 years old and be a resident and/or business owner in Gwinnett or attend a Gwinnett college or university. Class size is limited to 30 participants chosen by a selection committee

Lanier Community Garden has plots available for spring

The Lanier Community Garden, located on the Gwinnett County property of the Lanier Water Filter Plant, is accepting applications for plots in time for the spring growing season.

The garden is an all-volunteer organization that provides residents a place to grow fruit, herbs, vegetables and flowers for their families, local food banks, and other charitable organizations. It offers 79 garden plots including organic and traditional plots of two sizes. Larger plots cost \$45 annually and smaller plots cost \$22.50. Gwinnett County Bicentennial Moment - Fort Daniel

Fort Daniel was built in 1813 on Hog Mountain near the Creek and Cherokee Indian territories. The fort, which garrisoned the 25th Regiment of Georgia Militia, protected early settlers during the War of 1812. Named for Maj. Gen. Allen Daniel, the fort was later the staging point for the original Peachtree Road between Fort Daniel and another frontier fort in Buckhead.



Archeologists from the Fort Daniel Foundation recently found the identified the entrance to the fort, plus the remains of two blockhouses and wall trenches along with artifacts from the early 1800s. The County began preserving the land on Braselton Road near Buford in 2012 and now leases it to the foundation, which provides educational programs and the annual Fort Daniel Fair at the site.
