Gwinnett Animal Shelter offering St. Patrick's Day Special of \$20 per pet, Free Fridays for March



The Gwinnett Animal Welfare shelter is offering a Clear the Shelter St. Patrick's Day adoption special of only \$20 for dogs or cats, and all adoptions are FREE on Fridays for the month of March.

Many dogs and cats have been examined by Animal Welfare and Enforcement staff veterinarians, vaccinated, and neutered or spayed, so they are ready to go home on the day of adoption.

Shelter fees are typically \$90 for a dog, and \$30 for a cat. The shelter is open for adoptions Monday through Thursday from 11:00am to 6:00pm, and on Friday and Saturday from 11:00am to 4:00pm.

Gwinnett County Bicentennial Moment - Railroads in Gwinnett

Gwinnett County was relatively isolated until 1870 when the Atlanta and Richmond Air Line Railway was built, tying Atlanta to the Eastern seaboard. It was later renamed Atlanta and Charlotte Air Line Railroad, then the Georgia Air Line Railroad, then the Southern Railroad, and finally Norfolk Southern Railway. From 1879 to 1931, Southern Railroad ran passenger service called the Airline Belle between Atlanta and Toccoa. The tracks were laid along the Eastern Continental Divide ridgeline because it was fairly level and didn't require as many bridges. The railroad gave life to several towns, such as Norcross, Duluth, Suwanee, and Buford.

In 1881, a second railroad connected Suwanee and Lawrenceville, making the county seat much more accessible. Then, in 1891, the Georgia, Carolina, and Northern Railway, was built through the center of the county to help move cotton and other crops from the Lilburn, Lawrenceville, and Dacula areas. It later merged with Seaboard Airline Railway, now part of CSX.
