Last day for plant sale orders: March 7

Coffee with a Cop set for March 10

Don't forget about the upcoming Coffee with Cop on Friday, **March 10** from **9:00am** to **11:00am** at Einstein Bros. Bagels, 3410 Buford Drive, Suite G400, in Buford.

Gwinnett County police will be available to field questions or talk about issues that concern the public. The program is part of an ongoing initiative to build healthy relationships between police and the public.

Be wary of jury duty scams

Jury duty scams are on the rise again, so watch out for these fraudulent calls. Typically the caller says it's the Gwinnett Sheriff's Office calling to tell the victims that they didn't show up for jury duty and that they now owe a fine of as much as \$900, which can be paid over the phone with a prepaid debit card. Gwinnett County's law enforcement agencies do not call people to demand money.

Every year, thousands of potential jurors in Gwinnett are selected randomly by computer from a database of registered voters and licensed drivers and summoned by mail. The summons explains the one-day-or-one-trial system and gives instructions on when and where to report for duty. If you don't show up, they contact you again - also by mail.



If you've been scammed, report it to the Gwinnett County Sheriff's Office Investigative Services Division at 770.619.6655.

Reduce your tax bill by applying for homestead exemptions

The best way to reduce your property tax bill is to apply for homestead exemptions. The application

deadline is **April 1.** You must own and occupy the property as your primary residence as of January 1 of the tax year for which application is being made. No exemptions are granted automatically; however, once an exemption is granted, there is no need to apply each year.
