

Tax assessors board mails annual assessment notices

The Gwinnett County Board of Assessors mailed approximately 275,000 annual [notices of current assessment](#) to residential and commercial property owners on **Friday, April 8**. The intent of the notice is to provide property owners with the current value associated with their property for the ad valorem tax process compared to last year's value as well as an estimate of taxes based on the new/current value. The mandated calculation process for the estimated taxes often results in a figure that is different from actual taxes for the property; additional discussion of this is included below. Register to vote in May 24 election

Make sure you're registered to vote and eligible to cast a ballot in the **May 24** General Primary/Nonpartisan Election. Residents have until **April 26** to register. To register to vote in Georgia, you must be a citizen of the United States, a legal resident of Georgia and of the county in which you wish to vote, and at least 18 years old by Election Day. You may not register to vote if you are currently serving any sentence imposed by the conviction of a felony or judicially determined to be mentally incompetent.



Register to vote online

You can now register to vote online if you have a Georgia issued personal identification card or driver's license. Visit the Georgia Secretary of State's website at www.mvp.sos.ga.gov/.

Need a mobile option? There's an app for that! Download GA Votes from the Apple Store or the Droid Play Store to your phone or tablet device. You can register to vote and make updates to your voter registration. You can also get information about your polling location, view sample ballots, find satellite voting locations, and receive push notifications.

Police hosts annual Multicultural Festival
