

The third annual Gwinnett Multicultural Festival will take place **Saturday, April 30** from 11:00am to 3:00pm in the Gwinnett Place Mall parking lot near the Tandy Key Lane entrance (between the old JC Penney and Belk stores).

Library system's new hours, consistent schedule increase access to services

The Gwinnett County Public Library is expanding branch hours and revising schedules to make hours at the county's 15 branches consistent.

Effective **Monday, May 16**, Gwinnett County's library branches will operate:

Monday - Thursday: 10:00am to 8:00pm

Friday and Saturday: 10:00am to 5:00pm

Sunday: Noon to 5:00pm

This 5K obstacle run is designed to challenge runners of all levels. The course leads runners around the jail campus, where they will encounter all levels of terrain and extreme obstacles.

Poll workers still needed for upcoming elections

The Voter Registrations and Elections Division needs dedicated citizens to serve as paid poll officials for the 2016 elections. Successful poll officials demonstrate patience, enjoy working with people, take direction well, and are detail oriented. Applicants must be a U.S. citizen and a resident of Gwinnett County, at least 16 years old, and able to read, write, and speak English. Those who were convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude or judicially determined to be mentally incompetent are not eligible to serve as a poll official.
