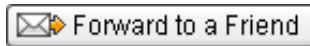

Poll officials still needed for upcoming elections

The Voter Registrations and Elections Division still needs dedicated citizens to serve as paid poll officials for the upcoming elections. Successful poll officials demonstrate patience, enjoy working with people, take direction well, and are detail oriented. Applicants must be a U.S. citizen and a resident of Gwinnett County, at least 16 years old, and able to read, write, and speak English. Those who have been convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude or judicially determined to be mentally incompetent are not eligible to serve as a poll official. Homestead exemption application deadline: April 1



The best way to reduce your property tax bill is to apply for homestead exemption. The application deadline is April 1. For all exemptions, you must own and occupy the property as your primary residence as of January 1 of the year for which application is being made. Applications for 2016 exemptions will not be processed after April 1.

You may apply online or contact the Tax Commissioner's Property Tax Department for an application. If you mail the completed application, please use certified mail; the signed certified signature card along with a postmark on or before

the deadline will serve as proof of timely application. Once granted, the homestead exemption is automatically renewed each year.

Register for Walk Georgia

Walk across the state of Georgia - virtually - by signing up for the University of Georgia/Gwinnett Cooperative Extension Walk Georgia program. Walk Georgia is a 12-week program that helps you increase your physical activity and develop the get-moving habit.

Sign up and log on **March 4 through May 14** to report everything that gets you moving. Anything from a walk around the block to gardening or playing a game of pick-up basketball counts. Logging all of your activities adds up the miles, allowing you to "unlock" Georgia counties and take an online tour through our great state.

The program is free and you may register as an individual or team. Either way, you'll have fun as you get fit! Prizes will be awarded to the top three participants who submit the most miles: \$50 gift card for running shoes for first place; salad mixers, lip balms, and sports bags for second and third place.
