

County offices closed for Christmas, New Year's holidays

All Gwinnett County government offices, with the exception of those operations required for the comfort and safety of residents, will be closed **Thursday, December 24** and **Friday, December 25** for the Christmas holiday and reopen on **Monday, December 28**. Offices will also be closed **Friday, January 1** for the New Year's holiday and reopen **Monday, January 4**. A Magistrate Court judge will be available at the Gwinnett County Detention Center during the Christmas and New Year's holidays.

Christmas Day and New Year's Day are trash and recycling holidays in unincorporated Gwinnett County. If your normal collection day takes place on one of these holidays, your collection will be delayed. Please visit www.sustainablegwinnett.com to view the detailed collection schedule. If you live within city limits, please contact your city hall for your trash and recycling schedule.

Correction: Workshop on January 7 helps homeowners care for detention ponds

The *Events in Gwinnett County* newsletter issued last week mistakenly listed septic tank maintenance as the topic for a workshop on January 7. Detention pond maintenance is the topic for the upcoming workshop. The septic tank maintenance workshop will be held on August 11 at the Buford Human Services Center, 2755 Sawnee Avenue in Buford. We apologize for any confusion caused by this error.

The Department of Water Resources will host a free detention pond maintenance workshop for residents to learn how to care for detention ponds in their neighborhoods. The workshop will be held on **Thursday, January 7 at 6:00pm** at the **Norcross Human Services Center, 5030 Georgia Belle Court in Norcross**. Attendees from unincorporated Gwinnett County, city of Lilburn, or city of Peachtree Corners may qualify for a maximum 5 percent credit on their stormwater utility fee for the following year. There's still time to comment on the proposed 2016 budget



Gwinnett Commission Chairman Charlotte Nash presented a proposed \$1.5 billion budget for fiscal year 2016 to the Board of Commissioners during a [briefing](#) in November. Five county residents and business people served on Nash's budget review committee. After hearing presentations from elected officials and department directors in late August and early September, the group studied departmental business plans, budget needs, and revenue projections to make recommendations for the 2016 budget.

Commissioners held a [public hearing](#) on Monday, December 7. Written comments are still welcome through an [online comment form](#) until **Thursday, December 31**. The Board expects to adopt the 2016 budget on **Tuesday, January 5**.

Holiday safety tips for sipping and serving

If you are hosting a party or other event to celebrate the holidays, it's imperative to recognize your responsibility in keeping others safe. Here are a few tips to help make hosting easier, safer, and more enjoyable for everyone. When hosting an adult party with alcohol, it's important to serve more than just alcoholic beverages; provide high-protein food, limit alcohol consumption, and encourage the use of designated drivers. If you are hosting a party for youth, do not serve alcohol. If you serve alcohol to anyone under 21, you could face criminal charges of up to 12 months in jail or a fine of \$1,000. Also, make sure you provide adult supervision to help prevent underage drinking and other risky behaviors from taking place. For more information, visit www.guideinc.org. Drop off your Christmas tree for recycling

Once the holidays are over, don't forget to recycle your Christmas tree. You can drop off your **live, undecorated tree** at one of the [convenient locations](#) between **December 26** and **January 16** in Gwinnett County. The trees will be chipped during Gwinnett Clean and Beautiful's Bring One for the Chipper event on **Saturday, January 23** from **9:00am to noon** at **Bethesda Park**, located at **225 Bethesda Church Road in Lawrenceville**, near the soccer fields. The mulch from the trees will be used for County parks, roadway landscaping, facilities, etc.

Please note that unless you have a yard waste contract with your hauler, trees will not be collected curbside.
