Budget review meetings available online and TVgwinnett



Budget review meetings take place during the first two weeks of September, near the end of the County's annual budget planning cycle. Representatives from departments and agencies recently presented their business plans and proposed budgets to Commission Chairman Charlotte Nash and the budget review team made up of citizens and County staff.

SPLOST citizen selection committee holds first meeting: September 16

The work of the SPLOST Citizens Project Selection Committee for transportation will get underway during the group's first meeting that will take place on Monday, **September 16 at 6:00pm** in the [DOT Central Facility](#), located at 620 Winder Highway in Lawrenceville. The meeting is open to the public and will be attended by the peer-selected representatives of six major interest groups who were selected to serve on the committee—homeowners (one each from the four commission districts), the business community, environmental stakeholders, schools, civic organizations, and Gwinnett County's seniors.



A referendum going before voters on **November 5** will ask whether they wish to renew the one-cent special purpose local option sales tax, or SPLOST, after the current program ends next March. If approved, the **SPLOST program will focus primarily on transportation** but will also include funding for other purposes such as public safety, parks, libraries, and senior facilities. The new program will end in March 2017 and raise an estimated total \$498 million. According to an intergovernmental agreement between Gwinnett County and the 16 cities, county government will receive 78.9 percent of the proceeds and the cities will receive 21.1 percent. The County has determined that 70 percent of its share, or an estimated \$275 million, will be dedicated to

transportation projects such as roads, bridges, intersection improvements, and sidewalks.

New speed limits along Peachtree Industrial Boulevard

Gwinnett County recently **lowered the speed limits along Peachtree Industrial Boulevard** to 45 miles per hour from SR 141/Peachtree Parkway to SR 20/Nelson Brogdon Boulevard and 50 mph from SR 20 to the Hall County line. The changes were made for safety, consistency, and accident history. Transportation staff reviewed speed studies, crash history, and drove the corridor during peak hours before recommending the speed limit be lowered.

Police Department offers firearms safety seminar



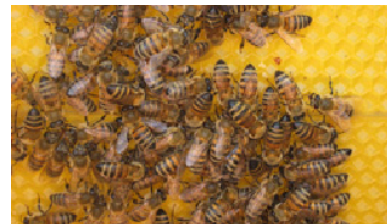

Be a poll official



On Election Day, approximately 3,000 of your neighbors serve Gwinnett County voters by working as poll officials. You can be one of them! As a poll official at one of our polling places, you will play an active role in ensuring the ongoing success of the electoral process.

For the upcoming November 5 special election, Gwinnett County needs an **additional 100 detail-oriented individuals** who take pride in their work, enjoy working with people, and take direction well.

Whenever possible, poll officials are assigned to their home precinct, however, if there are no vacancies at your polling place, you may be asked to work at a nearby precinct. Requirements for poll officials include completing an online training program and remaining at your assigned poll location from 6:00am until election-related duties are completed on Election Day. Polls are open to voters from 7:00am to 7:00pm.
