Gwinnett Police distributes more than 3,500 toys to children in need

Get to know your local officers at Coffee with a Cop


Join your neighbors and local police officers to build new relationships one cup at a time. You're invited to ask questions, voice concerns, and get to know the officers who

Stay on the line and let the dispatcher know it was an accident. If you don't, the dispatcher will proceed as if your call is an emergency and send a police officer out to check. Accidental calls tie up operators and take away vital resources from callers in need.

Safety tip of the month: secure your vehicle

As car break-ins increase, we want to ensure your valuables are always protected. Here are some tips to help you avoid becoming a victim of a car break-in:

- Always lock your vehicle and close your windows completely
- Engage your car alarm
- If you have a garage, park your car inside it
- Lock your car doors before walking away from the vehicle
- Do not leave valuable items such as purses, backpacks, laptops, cell phones, tablets, or firearms inside your vehicle
- If you need to secure items in your vehicle temporarily, always place them out of sight
- Secure valuable items before you reach your destination as criminals may watch you when you
 place them in your trunk
- Never leave valuables in your vehicle overnight
- Make sure items of value aren't visible when looking in your car
- Report any suspicious vehicles, activity, or individuals to the Police Department
