Stay informed about the future of Gwinnett transportation



Gwinnett's Comprehensive Transportation Plan, Transit Development Plan, and Airport Master Plan are underway! The Comprehensive Transportation Plan, in coordination with the Atlanta Regional Commission, will consider how all modes of transportation operate as an interconnected system, and the Transit Development Plan, developed over an 18-month period, will serve as a guiding document that will address mobility, enhance existing and future transit development opportunities, and improve the quality of life across the county and Gwinnett's 16 cities. An updated Airport Master Plan will also guide investment at the

Gwinnett County Airport in Lawrenceville.

Residents will soon have the opportunity to engage with the planning teams and help identify and address current and future needs in transportation across the county.
