### Gwinnett unveils new name and look for transit system

After nearly 22 years of service, the County unveiled a new name and a new brand for its transit system — Ride Gwinnett. Embodying the County's vibrant brand, Ride Gwinnett represents how the county will connect people to where they need to go. The rebranding includes the County's transit website, buses, bus stop shelters, and signs.

Ride Gwinnett has seven local routes, five commuter routes, complimentary paratransit for local routes, three Park and Ride locations, and one transit center. To explore current bus routes and schedule, fare prices, and more, visit [RideGwinnett.com](#).



### Gwinnett earns Platinum recertification as a Green Community

Gwinnett County continues to uphold its commitment to sustainability, earning recertification as a Green Community at the Platinum level by the Atlanta Regional Commission. Developed in 2009, the [Green Communities Program](#) is a voluntary sustainability certification program that helps local governments implement measures that reduce their environmental impact through actionable measures.



As a Green Community, Gwinnett earned recognition for the implementation of [sustainable policies, practices, and programs](#) for a stronger, greener community. Gwinnett first earned certification as a Green Community in 2010 and became the first county to be certified at the Platinum level in 2018.

## Gwinnett Corrections hosts career fair January 21

Gwinnett County Corrections will host a career fair on **Saturday, January 21 from 8:00am to 3:00pm**. To go through the hiring process, interested applicants are encouraged to arrive by noon to take part in a facility tour, background check, and behavioral assessment. They can also [apply online](#) for correctional officer and senior correctional officer positions.

The career fair will take place at the Comprehensive Correctional Complex, located at 750 Hi Hope Road in Lawrenceville. This is a secure facility and personal items — including cell phones — are not allowed inside. As a COVID-19 precaution, attendees are required to wear a mask in the facility. 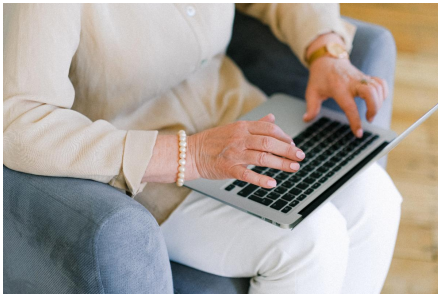
## Learn more about the 2040 Unified Plan Amendment

The Board of Commissioners adopted an amendment to the [Gwinnett 2040 Unified Plan](#), which was originally adopted in 2019 and outlines community goals, needs and opportunities, housing, transportation, economic development, and future land use. The amendment — adopted September 27, 2022 — replaces portions of the Future Development Map section of the plan. This amendment includes minor modifications to existing character areas, the creation of an additional character area, adjustments to the Future Development Map, and a more detailed list of development types.



The amendment serves as an interim update to the plan as the County prepares for the next major update, which will become the 2045 Unified Plan. Community engagement for the 2045 Unified Plan will begin early this year.

## Seniors may qualify for tax breaks



Older adults qualify for some tax breaks in Gwinnett. Residents who are 65 or older as of January 1 with Georgia taxable income below \$112,048 might qualify for the Senior School Tax Homestead Exemption.

An emissions waiver is available for seniors 65 or older whose vehicles are at least 10 years old and driven less than 5,000 miles per year. To check eligibility and apply, visit [GwinnettTaxCommissioner.com/Seniors](http://GwinnettTaxCommissioner.com/Seniors).

Through the CAPS program, qualified families may be able to attend at little to no cost.
