The Gwinnett Police Department will be hosting a community meeting to discuss youth homicides and the number of overdoses among teens on **Thursday, March 9** at 6:30pm in Norcross. The event will take place at the Universal Church located at 6081 Singleton Road in Norcross. Police Chief J.D. McClure and members of the command staff from West Precinct and Criminal Investigations will be part of the panel discussion. Spanish language assistance will be available.


Find a rewarding career with Gwinnett County Government

Gwinnett awarded federal grant to address roadway safety issues



Gwinnett County has been awarded \$200,000 in federal funding through the U.S. Department of Transportation's <u>Safe Streets and Roads for All grant program</u>. The County will contribute a match of \$50,000 for a total of \$250,000 to create the Countywide Safety Action Plan, which will implement measures that prevent roadway deaths and injuries. This plan will aim at reducing motorist, bicyclist, and pedestrian fatalities on Countymaintained roads and state routes.

The Gwinnett Department of Transportation has identified safety improvement projects through various ongoing

planning efforts, including the Comprehensive Transportation Plan, the Safe and Equitable Access Study, and the recent voter-approved Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program.

Tax Assessor's Office issues Real Estate Property Annual Notices of Assessment



Most Residential and Commercial Annual Notices of Assessment for 2023 will be mailed in April. An Annual Notice of Assessment is not a tax bill. The notice informs you of the value assessed on your residential or commercial real estate as of January 1, 2023. Property owners may appeal the assessed value within 45 days of the date of the notice by submitting a completed PT-311A state appeal form to the Tax Assessors' Office or visiting Gwinnett-Assessor.com.
