

County awarded SMART grant for safety improvements on Singleton Road

The Gwinnett Department of Transportation was awarded a \$1,053,400 Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation grant from the United States Department of Transportation.

The SMART grant will be used to examine safety and mobility technological solutions — such as focused lighting and warnings — for all roadway users along Singleton Road. Funding will also be used to update the



County's Connected Vehicle Technology Master Plan, which previously identified smart corridor deployment.

Tax Assessors' Office issues Annual Notice of Assessment

Most Residential and Commercial Annual Notices of Assessment for 2023 will be mailed in April. An <u>Annual Notice of Assessment</u> is not a tax bill. The notice informs you of the value assessed on your residential or commercial real estate as of January 1, 2023.

Property owners may appeal the assessed value within 45 days of the date of the notice by submitting a completed PT-311A State Appeal Form to the Tax Assessors' Office or by visiting Gwinnett-Assessor.com.
