Attend a town hall meeting this evening

District 3 Commissioner Jasper Watkins III and District 4 Commissioner Matthew Holtkamp will host town hall meetings tonight, March 27 to share updates about their districts:

- State of District 3: In-person from 6:30pm to 7:30pm at the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center in Lawrenceville
- District 4 Town Hall: In-person from 6:00pm to 8:00pm at Seckinger High School in Buford

The sessions will highlight key takeaways from Chairwoman Nicole Love Hendrickson's State of the



County address, provide updates on projects and initiatives in their respective districts, and inform attendees about the Board of Commissioners' intent to call for a transit referendum.

Gwinnett officials unveil the new Sensory Treehouse

Gwinnett officials unveiled the new Sensory Treehouse, designed to enhance access to enrichment opportunities for residents and visitors with disabilities. The 20-foot-tall treehouse sits central to the 340-foot-long accessible steel walkway with three nodes, surrounded by a viewing and activity platform and a high-hanging hammock. Inside the treehouse, visitors can enjoy a circular audio-visual



experience with a domed ceiling, used for various teaching and entertainment experiences. The entire structure is ADA-accessible, allowing those in a wheelchair to reach an area in the forest that wouldn't be possible with conventional footpaths.

Gwinnett County used \$4.5 million in SPLOST funds for the project. The treehouse is located on the grounds of the Gwinnett Environmental and Heritage Center in unincorporated Buford.

High school-age students in Gwinnett County are invited to apply to the Gwinnett Youth Commission, a year-long leadership development program. GYC focuses on personal and professional development, civic engagement, and public service. Youth Commissioners are representative voices of the County's youth and serve as representatives to elected officials.
