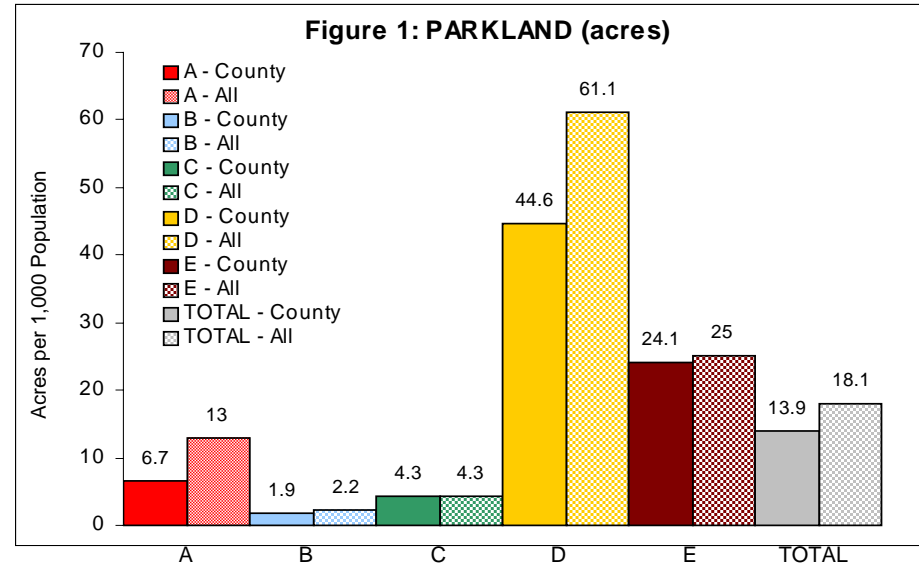
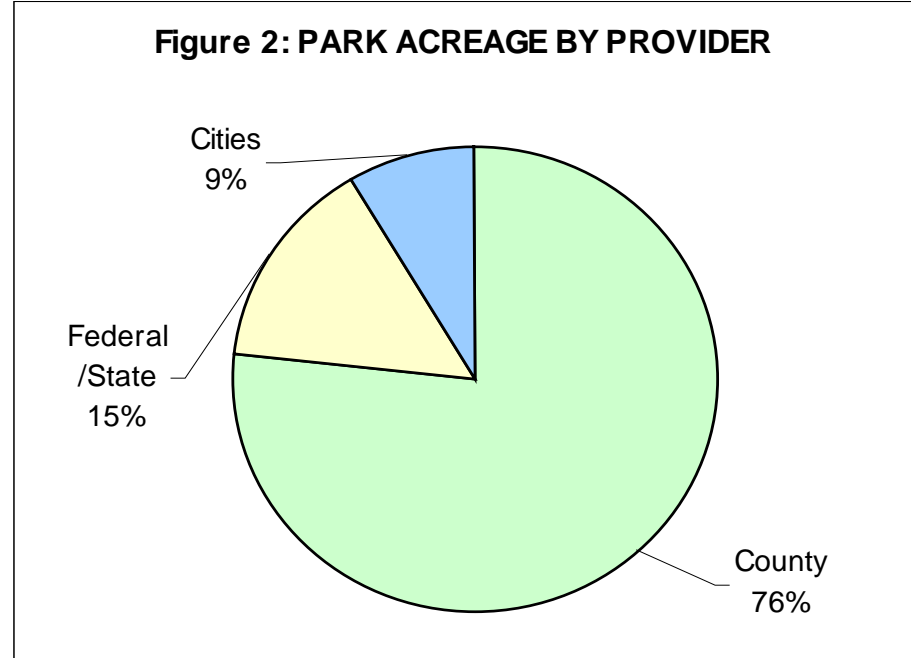

Plan Area D, in part due to the 1800-acre Harbins/Alcovy Park Site, contains over half of Gwinnett's parkland. Plan Areas B and C are the most deficient.

Figure 2 illustrates the breakdown of parkland between the major providers in the community - Gwinnett County, local cities, and the State and Federal governments. In relation to parkland, Gwinnett County is clearly the most significant landowner in the area with over three-quarters of the base of publicly accessible parkland.

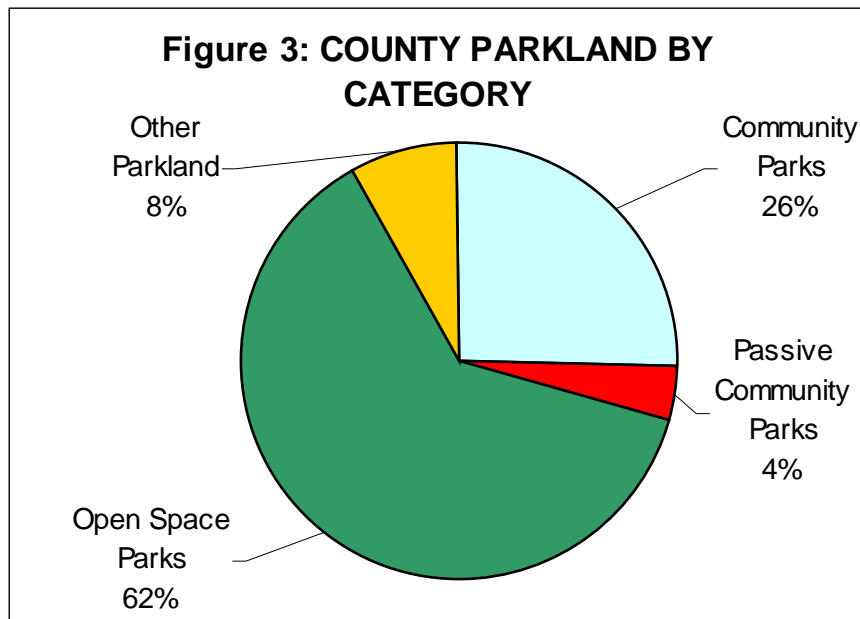

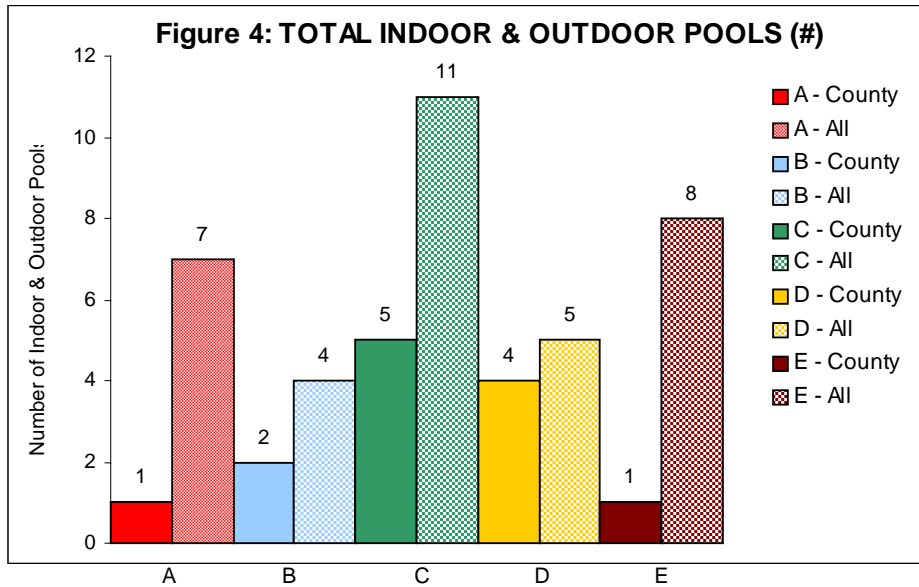
As Figure 3 indicates, 62% of Gwinnett County's parkland is classified as "Open Space" - most of these parks are large parcels that are intended to remain largely in their natural state. Again, Plan Area D clearly has the more parkland than the others, while Plan Areas B and C are the most deficient in terms of overall parkland, community parkland, and open space parkland (of which they have none).

Based on overall supply, the greatest number of swimming pools (both "County only" and "All") is in Plan Area C. Plan Areas A and E have the fewest County pools and Plan Area B has the fewest overall number of pools. There are no indoor pools in Plan Area E and only one in Plan Area A.

In terms of per capita ratios, Plan Area B has the poorest overall service level (1 per 28,500 indoor/outdoor pools).

The Gwinnett Sports Center (private) contributes greatly to the overall supply of indoor hard court surfaces (gymnasiums) with a total of 7 courts. The private sector is a major supplier of gymnasium space (as are schools, which were not inventoried).

Plan Area A contains nearly 60% of the county's gymnasiums, while Plan Area B contains no facilities. The service levels in Plan Areas C and E are also well below the County average.

Note: Double gymnasiums are equivalent to two single gymnasiums.

Plan Areas A and D have both the greatest number of baseball and softball diamonds and the lowest ratio of diamonds to youth ages 0-19. The County is the largest supplier of ball fields, with an average service level of 1 diamond for every 6,396 population (or 1,962 children and youth).

The County is the primary provider in Plan Areas B and C, both of which have the fewest diamonds to population.

In 2002, there were 16,313 baseball/softball players registered with Athletic Associations in Gwinnett. Approximately 127 diamonds were available for their use (7 County diamonds are reserved for adults). This translates into an average of one diamond per 128 players.

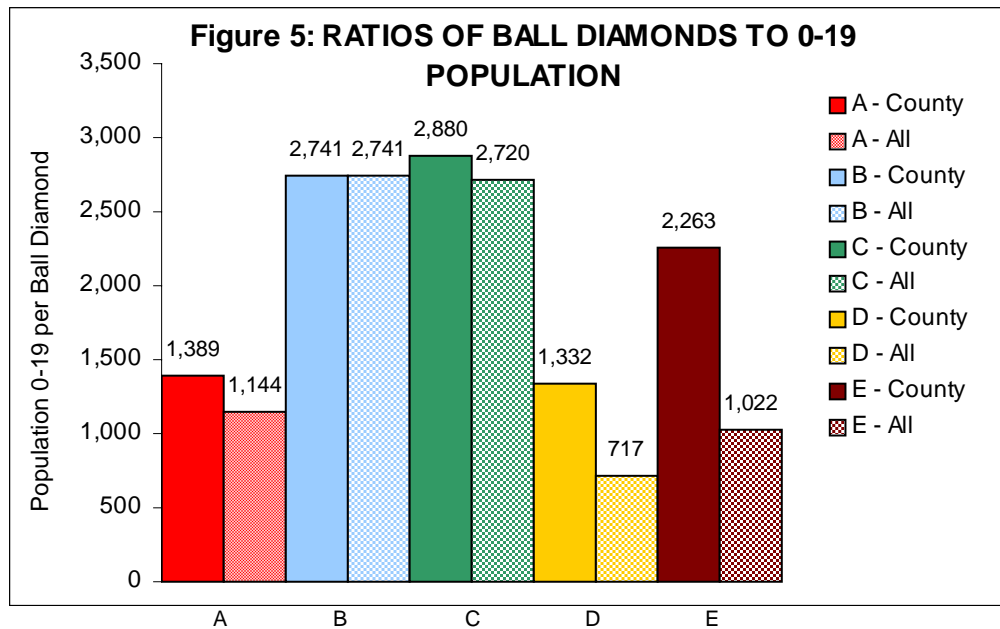
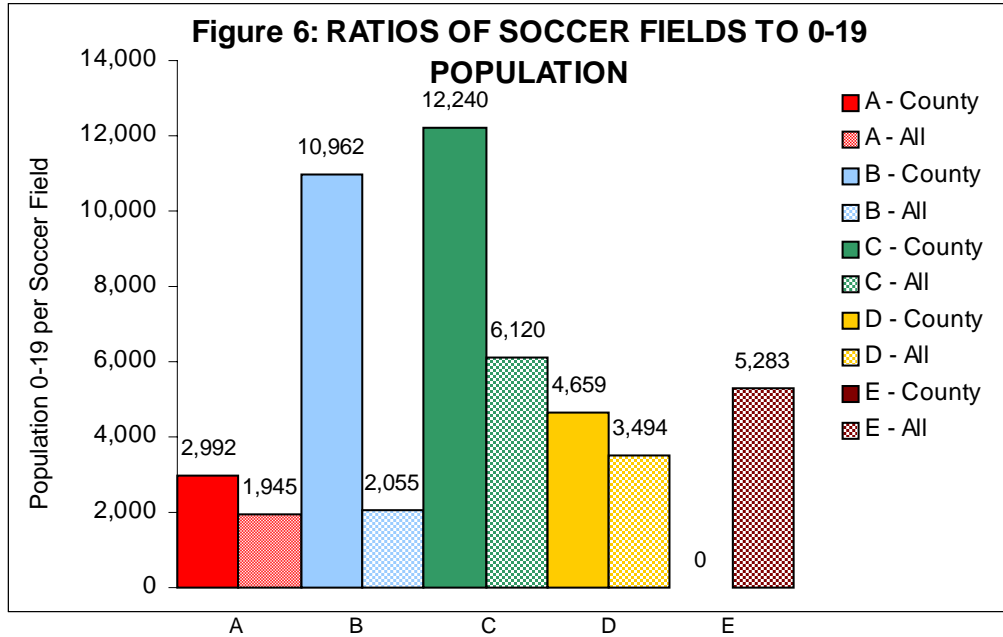

In Gwinnett, the cities and private/not-for-profit enterprise supply 55% of the soccer field inventory. The distribution of soccer fields is relatively good, although Plan Areas C and E have the fewest number of fields resulting in a slightly higher ratio of population to fields. Plan Areas A and B have the largest supply of soccer facilities.

In 2002, there were 13,072 soccer players registered with Athletic Associations in Gwinnett. Approximately 57 fields were available for their use (1 County field is reserved for adults). This translates into an average of one field per 229 players.

Football fields are mostly provided by the County and are very well distributed throughout Gwinnett. Plan Area A has the most favorable supply of County-owned football fields with 4. In 2002, there were 3,727 football players in Gwinnett's Athletic Association for an average of one field for every 233 players.

Plan Areas A, E and D have the most favorable supplies and ratios of playground areas - each area offers one playground area for every 537 to 1,174 children ages 0-9 (county, city, federal and private parks included). With ratios of 2,084 and 2,176 respectively, Plan Areas B and C are equally deficient compared to the other geographic areas.

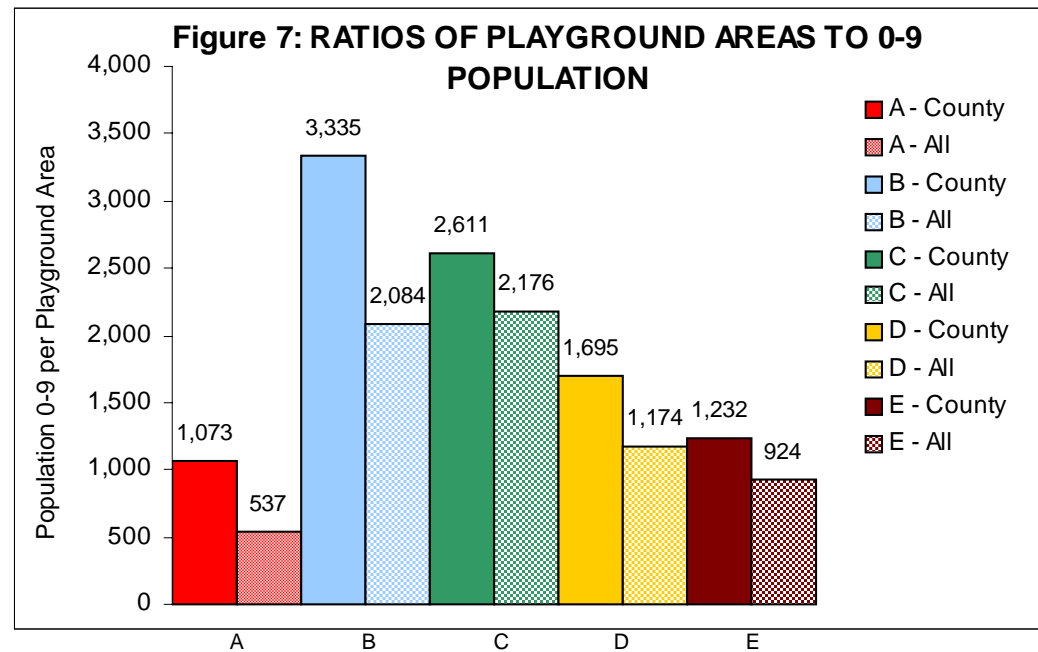

Over 75% of the tennis courts captured in the inventory are provided by agencies other than Gwinnett County. This percentage is likely much higher if subdivision tennis complexes are accounted for.

Overall, there is a good distribution of tennis courts across Gwinnett, although Plan Area B appears to have a less than equitable supply. The County provides very few tennis opportunities in Plan Areas C and E, as illustrated by Figure 8.

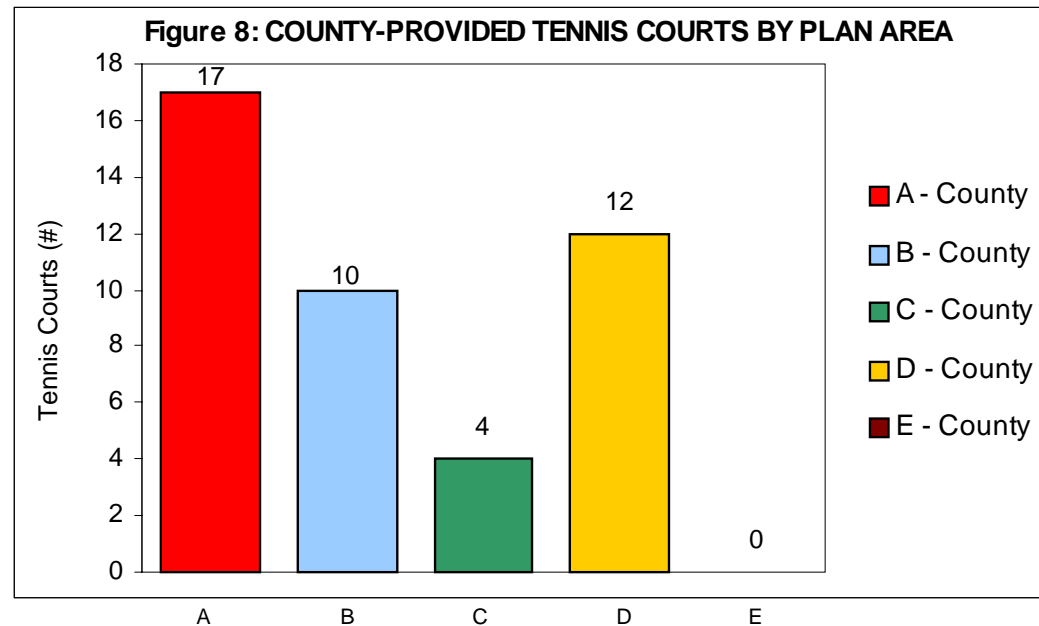

Like basketball, the private sector, local cities and federal sites provide a slightly greater number of sand volleyball courts than does the County. The distribution of courts favors Plan Areas D and A (8 and 6 respectively), while Plan Areas B and C (1 each) are less adequately served. Service levels range dramatically for this facility.

The County provides pavilions in many of its parks for the community to rent. Plan Area A contains the greatest number of County and overall pavilions. The distribution of County pavilions is relatively equal amongst the other areas, with Plan Areas B and C having the fewest of this facility type.

Although the County's Parks and Recreation Division does not provide any golf facilities, an inventory of private (and one city) courses was conducted. As Table 21 illustrates, Plan Area D has the most favorable ratio of golf holes to population, while Plan Areas B and C contain the fewest number of facilities.
