


Census 2000 Selected Race and Ethnic Characteristics



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INTRODUCTION

This report is the first in a series of reports that present data from the 2000 Census. The reports concentrate on demographic changes over the past ten years at the census tract level for Gwinnett County and on the county level for the Atlanta Region. The text summarizes and describes data depicted in the maps and tables.

The purpose of these reports is to provide access to sub-county level demographic data. Each report covers various topics and will be published as data become available and associated processing and analyses are complete. Report topics will include population and housing changes, income and poverty status, and labor force characteristics.

Information from the 2000 Census concerning population and ethnicity is presented in this report. Changes from 1990 to 2000 in race and ethnicity are also presented. This report offers two primary areas of information: the number and proportion of the major ethnic groups in Gwinnett's 2000 census tracts and the changes from 1990 to 2000 in the number and proportion of these ethnic groups by 1990 census tract.

In this report and others, 2000 Census data are aggregated to the 1990 census tract level. This enables comparisons between 1990 and 2000 data. Census tracts are small, somewhat permanent statistical subdivisions of a county or equivalent area. The primary purpose of census tracts is to provide a relatively stable set of geographic units for the presentation of decennial census data. When first delineated, census tract boundaries are designed to be fairly homogeneous with respect to population, economic status and living conditions. The spatial size of the census tracts varies widely depending on the density of area. (Summary File 1, 2000 Census of Population and Housing,

Technical Documentation; U.S. Census Bureau, June 2001, p. A-11).

Census tracts are split due to population growth or aggregated due to population decline. In Gwinnett County the number of census tracts increased from 45 in 1990 to 71 in 2000. Split tracts can be reformed to construct the original census tract. For example the 1990 census tract 501.01 located in the Buford area was split into the 2000 tracts of 501.03 and 501.04. To make comparisons between 1990 and 2000 for that area, the 2000 data for the two tracts must be aggregated.

RACE AND ETHNICITY

Information from the 1990 and 2000 Census concerning population and ethnicity is presented in this report. **Table 1** presents the number and proportion of the major racial and ethnic groups in Gwinnett County by 2000 census tract. These data can be used to identify the current number and composition of Gwinnett County's population. **Table 2** lists the changes from 1990 to 2000 in Gwinnett County's ethnic composition by 1990 census tract. Data located in this table may be used to measure an area's change or stability with respect to ethnic mix.

The Census data on race were derived from answers to the question on race that was asked of all people. The concept of race reflects self-identification by people according to the race or races with which they most closely identify. These categories are socio-political constructs and should not be interpreted as scientific or anthropological in nature. Furthermore, the race categories include both racial and national-origin groups. (Summary File 1, 2000 Census of Population and Housing, Technical Documentation; U.S. Census Bureau, June 2001, p. B-12).

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The data on race in the 2000 Census **are not directly comparable** to those collected in previous censuses. Changes in 2000 included: respondents were allowed to select more than one race, the sequence of the questions on race and Hispanic origin were changed, and there were several terminology changes to the response categories. These data on race should be used as general guidelines and with caution. 2000 Census race and ethnic categories include:

White – a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.

Black or African-American – a person having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa.

American Indian or Alaska Native – a person having origins in any of the original peoples of North or South America and who maintain tribal affiliation or community attachment.

Asian – a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent.

Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander – a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.

Some Other Race - includes all other responses not included in the above categories.

Two or more races – People who may have chosen to provide two or more races. There were 57 possible combinations.

For more detailed information concerning race data and comparability to earlier censuses, see pages B8-B9 and B12-B16 Summary File 1, 2000 Census of Population and Housing,

The term ethnic is used in this report because the classification "Hispanic" can refer to persons of any racial group. In other words, a person can be of Hispanic origin regardless of race. This report presents data by race and by Hispanic origin. The data contained in **Table 1** and **Table 2** are for race or ethnic group alone. For example, the term "Black" includes all persons that identified themselves as Black and not Hispanic while the term "White" refers to persons that identified themselves as White and not of Hispanic origin. The category minority includes all persons that identified themselves as Black alone, Asian alone, American Indian or Alaskan Native alone, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander alone, or Hispanic/Latino.

Extraordinary Growth in Total Population

Figure 1 and **Figure 2** depict the net and percent change between 1990 and 2000 in Gwinnett County's total population by 1990 census tract. Gwinnett County's population totaled 352,910 persons in 1990. By 2000 Gwinnett had a population of 588,448 persons - an increase of 235,538 persons or 67%.

Overall the 10-county Atlanta Region added almost one million new residents between 1990 and 2000. Gwinnett County experienced the largest net increase followed by Fulton County with over 167,000 new residents and Cobb County with 160,000 additional persons. The largest percentage change occurred in Cherokee County – an increase of 103% followed by Gwinnett's 67%.

The largest net population gains occurred in the census tracts located in the central and northeastern areas of the county. In particular census tracts 502.03 and 505.06 in Duluth,

502.02 in Suwanee, 505.02 and 505.03 in Lawrenceville, and 506.01 in Dacula all had population increases of over 15,000 persons between 1990 and 2000. The largest population change occurred in census tract 505.03. This area located northeast of Lawrenceville added over 22,000 new residents during the 1990s.

Less but still significant population growth occurred throughout south and southeastern Gwinnett including the Harbins, Grayson, Loganville, Alcovy River, and Centerville areas. Several census tracts experienced population increases ranging from 5,000 to 10,000 persons. The largest population increase occurred in census tract 507.05 – the Grayson area. This census tract added over 9,300 new residents – almost tripling its population since 1990.

The vast majority of the census tracts located in southwest Gwinnett including the Peachtree Corners, Norcross, Lilburn, Mountain Park, Stone Mountain, and Snellville areas experienced population increases of fewer than 5,000 persons. The southwestern section of Gwinnett is primarily developed with less suitable vacant property available for residential development as compared to other areas of the county. As a result these areas experienced smaller population increases during the last decade. It should be noted that these population changes were smaller relative to the incredible growth that occurred in other areas of the county. Most of the census tracts located in southwest Gwinnett experienced substantial population increases. In fact, many tracts added thousands of new residents.

One census tract however - 504.15 lost 79 persons. This census tract located adjacent to DeKalb County southwest of Stone Mountain Highway was the only tract in Gwinnett that experienced a decline in population. Small population gains occurred in several other

census tracts located in southwest Gwinnett including 503.04 (Peachtree Corners), 503.10 and 503.11 (Norcross), 504.12 (Mountain Park), and 504.16 (Stone Mountain). All of these tracts had increases of less than 500 persons.

While growth occurred in the vast majority of Gwinnett County during the 1990s, the county's primary growth pattern is fairly evident extending along the I-85, I-985 and Georgia Highway 316 corridors into the northeast and eastern-most portions of the county. Clearly, growth occurred in these areas because the vast amount of land available for residential development, the area's transportation system, and the availability of wastewater service that has allowed commercial and industrial development and greater housing densities.

Overall Increase in Minority Population

In 2000, Gwinnett had a total population of 588,448 persons. Of this total 67% or 394,164 persons were non-Hispanic White. Gwinnett's minority population (persons in the non-Hispanic Black, Asian, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander racial categories and Hispanic/Latino ethnic group) totaled 184,422 residents or 31%.

While Gwinnett's population increased by 67% between 1990 and 2000, the county's minority population increased by 397%. As a result of this tremendous increase, the proportion of the minority population in Gwinnett grew from 11% to 31%. Persons in the other and two or more race categories comprised the remaining two percent of Gwinnett's population. In comparison the minority population accounted for 43% of the Atlanta Region's total. DeKalb County had the largest minority population proportion - 66% followed by Clayton County with 63% and Fulton County with 53%. Forsyth County had the smallest minority population proportion – 7% followed closely by Cherokee County with 9%.

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Figure 3 shows the net change between 1990 and 2000 in Gwinnett County's minority population by 1990 census tract. Minority population increases occurred in all of Gwinnett's 1990 census tracts with the tracts located in Norcross and east-central Gwinnett including the Duluth, Gwinnett Place Mall and Club Drive/Old Norcross Road areas experiencing the largest increases. For instance, the minority population in census tract 502.03 located in the Duluth area increased by over 11,000 persons while the minority population in tract 505.06 located in the Old Norcross Road/Club Drive area increased by over 15,000 persons.

Figure 4 depicts the proportion of the minority population to the total population in Gwinnett County's 2000 census tracts. The large concentration of the minority population in southwest Gwinnett particularly in the I-85 corridor is evident. More specifically, census tracts located in the Peachtree Corners and Norcross areas and along I-85 had minority population proportions ranging from 52% to 81%. In particular census tract 504.18 bounded by I-85, Graves Road, South Norcross-Tucker Road and DeKalb County contained Gwinnett's largest minority population proportion - 81%.

Census tracts that contained minority populations ranging from 37% to 52% are located in the Duluth, Satellite Boulevard, Old Norcross Road, Cruse Road and Lilburn northwest of U.S. Highway 29 areas stretching into the Gwinnett Place Mall area and western Lawrenceville.

There has been a significant increase in the minority population proportion in the census tracts located just west and southeast of Lawrenceville, the Berkeley Lake, Duluth, and Chattahoochee River areas and in the Centerville and Snellville areas. These census tracts have minority population proportions

ranging from 23% to 37%.

The remaining 29 census tracts in Gwinnett had minority population proportions ranging from 8.5% to 23%. These tracts stretched from Suwanee and Sugar Hill through Dacula, Harbins, Loganville, and Grayson to Snellville and Mountain Park. Census tract 507.05 located in the Grayson area had Gwinnett's smallest minority population proportion - 8.5%.

Figure 5 shows the 1990-2000 net change in Gwinnett's minority population proportion. The minority population proportion increased in all of the county's census tracts with the largest increases occurring in the areas bordering DeKalb and Fulton counties including Norcross, Peachtree Corners and Lilburn. The proportion increase in these census tracts ranged from 38 to 50 percentage points. For example, the minority population proportion in census tract 503.06 increased from 18.6% in 1990 to 68.7% in 2000 - a proportion increase of 50 points.

The next largest increases occurred further into west-central Gwinnett including the Gwinnett Place Mall and Cruse Road/Old Norcross Road areas. The minority proportion increases in these tracts ranged from 27 to 38 percentage points. In comparison, the minority population proportion in Gwinnett increased from 11% in 1990 to 31% in 2000 or 20.9 percentage points.

Places that experienced smaller minority population proportion increases included Suwanee, Buford, Dacula, Harbins, Grayson, Snellville, and Mountain Park. The smallest increases occurred in census tract 503.07 in the Peachtree Corners/Chattahoochee River area - 4.0, census tract 503.11 encompassing downtown Norcross - 4.3, and census tract 506.02 including the Dacula, Harbins, and Alcovy River areas in extreme southeast Gwinnett bordering Walton and Barrow counties - 4.6. Generally these areas experienced

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smaller minority population proportion increases because of either the large growth in the non-minority population or the relative population stability in the tract. For example census tract 506.02 added over 7,400 persons between 1990 and 2000 of which over 6,400 were non-Hispanic White while census tracts 503.07 and 503.11 experienced population increases of less than 20% during the 1990s.

Blacks Remain Largest Minority Group

In 1990, Gwinnett County's Black population numbered 17,971 persons. During the 1990s the county's Black population increased by 327% and by 2000 76,387 Black persons resided in Gwinnett. As a result, the proportion of the Black population in the county increased from 5% to 13%. Blacks are Gwinnett's largest minority group – 41% of the county's minority population is comprised of Blacks. However this proportion has decreased from 48% in 1990 because of Gwinnett's faster growing Hispanic and Asian populations.

While Blacks residents comprised 13% of Gwinnett's total population, Black persons accounted for 32% of the regional population up slightly from 27% in 1990. The largest Black population proportion - 54% was in DeKalb County followed closely by Clayton County with 51%. While Blacks continue to comprise the largest minority group in the Atlanta Region, the proportion of Blacks to the total minority population has declined from 86% to 73% since 1990 because of the extraordinary population increase of other minority groups.

Figure 6 shows the net change between 1990 and 2000 in Gwinnett County's Black population by 1990 census tract. The Black population increased in all of Gwinnett County's census tracts during the 1990s with the exception of census tract 503.11. This census tract that includes downtown Norcross lost 11 Black

residents between 1990 and 2000. The largest net increases occurred in the census tracts located in the I-85 corridor stretching into Lawrenceville in central Gwinnett. Census tract 505.06 located west of Lawrenceville encompassing Club Drive, Cruse Road and Old Norcross Road experienced the largest net increase – over 7,100 new Black residents.

Figure 7 depicts Gwinnett County's Black population proportion by 2000 census tract. Gwinnett's Black population is concentrated in the Peachtree Corners, Norcross, and I-85 corridor areas. Census tracts 503.15 and 503.16 located in Peachtree Corners adjacent to DeKalb and Fulton counties had Black population proportions of 33.9% and 42.9% respectively. Black residents accounted for 20% to 30% of the total population in ten census tracts located in the Norcross area and within the I-85 corridor.

Two other areas with a substantial proportion of Black residents included census tract 501.05 in Buford and census tract 504.16 bounded by DeKalb County and the Yellow River south of Annistown Road in the Stone Mountain area. There were several census tracts located in the Duluth, Lawrenceville, Centerville, and Snellville areas with Black population proportions ranging from 10% to 20% reflecting the significant growth of the Black population in these areas during the 1990s.

Figure 8 shows the net change since 1990 in Gwinnett County's Black population proportion by 1990 census tract. As depicted the Black population proportion increased in the majority of the county's census tracts during the 1990s with the largest increases occurring in three distinct areas: Peachtree Corners, the I-85 corridor stretching from DeKalb County into southwestern Lawrenceville including the Burns Road, Dickens Road, and Old Norcross Road areas, and Stone Mountain and Centerville near

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the DeKalb County border in extreme southwest Gwinnett. In particular census tract 504.16 experienced a proportion increase of 27.3 and in 2000 Black residents comprised 29% of tract's total population. The majority of the remaining areas of Gwinnett including the Chattahoochee River, Berkeley Lake, Duluth, Suwanee, Sugar Hill, Buford, Lawrenceville, Dacula, Harbins, Grayson, Loganville, Snellville, and Mountain Park experienced Black population proportion increases of less than 10 points.

The proportion of the Black population decreased in two census tracts - 501.02 in Buford and 503.11 in Norcross. The Black population proportion in these tracts dropped slightly, -0.1 and -3.2 percentage points respectively. These proportions decreased because the number of Black persons actually declined in census tract 503.11 while census tract 501.02 experienced a large increase in its Hispanic population – over 1,300 persons or 600%. This was much larger than the increase in the census tract's Black population.

Dramatic Increase in Hispanic Population

Gwinnett County's Hispanic population increased 657% or by 55,667 persons during the 1990s. By 2000 over 64,000 persons of Hispanic origin lived in the county accounting for 11% of the total population. This proportion was up from 2.4% in 1990. In addition, the Hispanic population share of the county's minority population increased from 23% to 35%.

Persons of Hispanic origin comprised 7.3% of the Atlanta Region's population in 2000 up from 2.1% in 1990. Gwinnett County had the largest Hispanic population proportion – 11% followed by DeKalb County with 7.9%, Cobb County with 7.7% and Clayton County at 7.5%.

Figure 9 depicts the net change since 1990 in Gwinnett's Hispanic population by 1990 census

tract. The Hispanic population expanded throughout the county with the largest net increases experienced by the census tracts located in the I-85 corridor stretching from Norcross into Duluth and Lawrenceville in central Gwinnett. Census tract 503.12 located in Norcross experienced the largest net increase – over 5,100 new residents of Hispanic origin.

While all of Gwinnett's census tracts experienced net increases in Hispanic persons, the smallest change occurred in census tracts located in the Grayson, Snellville, Centerville, Mountain Park, and Stone Mountain areas. Most of these census tracts had Hispanic population increases of 500 persons or less. For instance census tract 504.15 located adjacent to DeKalb County in the Stone Mountain area had an increase of just 36 persons – the smallest change in the county.

Figure 10 shows the proportion of Gwinnett's Hispanic population by 2000 census tract. Spatially similar to other minority groups in the county, Gwinnett's Hispanic population was concentrated in the area bounded by Dickens and Britt Roads, Indian Trail-Lilburn Road, Buford Highway and DeKalb County east and west of I-85 in Norcross. Seven census tracts located in this section of Gwinnett County had Hispanic population proportions ranging from 30% to 47%. The largest proportions of persons of Hispanic origin were in census tracts 503.12 and 503.06 with 47.3% and 45% respectively.

However, as with other minority groups Gwinnett's Hispanic population dispersed further into the county during the 1990s. Because of the significant increase in Gwinnett's Hispanic population, many census tracts in the west-central section of the county including the Gwinnett Place Mall and Burns Road/Old Norcross Road area and in Buford now have Hispanic population proportions ranging from 10% to 20%.

Figure 11 presents the net change between 1990 and 2000 in the proportion of Gwinnett County's Hispanic population by 1990 census tract. During the 1990s the census tracts located in the Jimmy Carter Boulevard and Buford Highway area west of I-85 and the Jimmy Carter Boulevard, Graves Road and Singleton Road areas east of I-85 experienced extraordinary proportion increases ranging from 20 to 41.1 percentage points. In particular census tract 503.12 located in Norcross had the largest increase - 41.1.

Hispanic population proportions increased from 10 to 20 percentage points in other areas of Gwinnett reflecting the large net increase in Hispanic residents in these census tracts. These census tracts were primarily located east of Norcross straddling I-85 and stretching into Duluth and Lawrenceville.

Asian Population Continues to Grow

During the 1990s Gwinnett County's Asian and Pacific Islander population increased 319% or by 32,276 persons. By 2000 over 42,000 Asians lived in the county accounting for 7.2% of the total population up from 2.9% in 1990. Despite this incredible growth, the Asian/PI share of the county's minority population decreased from 27% to 23%. This proportion decrease was the direct result of the large increase in the Hispanic population proportion. In 2000 Asians and Pacific Islanders comprised Gwinnett's third largest minority group.

The growth in the Asian population was not limited to Gwinnett. Regionally, the Asian and Pacific Islander population increased by over 82,000 persons or 169%. Asians and Pacific Islanders comprised 4% of the Atlanta Region's population in 2000 up from 2% in 1990. Gwinnett had the largest Asian and Pacific Islander population proportion – 7.2% followed

by Clayton County with 4.5% and DeKalb County with 4%.

Figure 12 depicts the net change since 1990 in Gwinnett County's Asian and Pacific Islander population by 1990 census tract. The Asian/PI population grew throughout the county during the 1990s with the largest net increases occurring in west-central Gwinnett. Census tracts 502.03 and 505.06 located in the Duluth and Lawrenceville areas experienced Asian and Pacific Islander population increases of over 3,000 persons.

Figure 13 shows the proportion of Gwinnett's Asian population by 2000 census tract. Generally Gwinnett's Asian population is more dispersed than other minority groups ranging from southwest Gwinnett adjacent to DeKalb County to Lilburn and Mountain Park through central Gwinnett into the Duluth and Lawrenceville and Suwanee areas.

In 2000 five census tracts located throughout the Norcross, Berkeley Lake, Duluth, and Lawrenceville areas had Asian population proportions of over 15%. Census tract 503.09 in the Norcross and Berkeley Lake area contained Gwinnett's the largest Asian population proportion – 19%. Other places with a significant proportion of Asian residents (ranging from 5% to 15%) included census tracts in the Duluth, Lawrenceville, Norcross east of I-85, and Suwanee areas.

Figure 14 presents the net change between 1990 and 2000 in Gwinnett County's Asian and Pacific Islander population proportion by 1990 census tract. Asian and Pacific Islander population proportion increases ranging from 5 to 10 percentage points occurred in many census tracts that extended primarily from the Norcross, Lilburn and Mountain Park areas eastward into Duluth, Lawrenceville and Suwanee.

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Census tracts that experienced an increase of over 10 percentage points were located in Norcross, Berkeley Lake, Duluth and Lilburn. In particular census tract 503.09 located in the Norcross and Berkeley Lake area experienced the largest net increase – 15.2 percentage points. Gwinnett County's Asian and Pacific Islander population increased significantly during the 1990s both in the absolute number of persons as well as in its proportion to Gwinnett's total population.

Significant Decrease in Non-Hispanic White Majority Share

Gwinnett's non-Hispanic White population totaled 315,548 persons in 1990. By 2000 Gwinnett had a non-Hispanic White population of 397,164 persons - an increase of 78,616 persons or 25%. The Atlanta Region added almost 170,000 new non-Hispanic White residents between 1990 and 2000. Gwinnett County experienced the largest net increase followed by Fulton County with over 66,000 new residents and Henry County with 43,000 additional persons.

The largest percentage change occurred in Henry County – an increase of 84% followed by Cherokee County with 47%. The non-Hispanic White population actually decreased in two counties during the 1990s. DeKalb County and Clayton County had losses of approximately 70,000 and 47,000 persons respectively.

Figure 15 depicts the net change since 1990 in Gwinnett County's non-Hispanic White population by 1990 census tract. The growth in Gwinnett County's non-Hispanic White population during the 1990s was not evenly distributed throughout the county. By far the largest net increases occurred in the Suwanee, Buford, Dacula, Hog Mountain Harbins,

Grayson, and Loganville areas in northeastern and eastern Gwinnett. Census tracts 506.01, 502.02, 505.02 and 505.03 experienced the largest net change - over 10,000 new non-Hispanic White residents.

One of the most dramatic changes in the county since 1990 was the significant loss of non-Hispanic Whites in many of the census tracts located in the Norcross, Peachtree Corners, and Lilburn areas of southwest Gwinnett. Nineteen census tracts experienced population losses ranging from 287 to 4,255 persons.

Figure 16 shows the non-Hispanic White population proportion by 2000 census tract. In 2000, 67% of Gwinnett's population was composed of non-Hispanic White persons. Gwinnett's non-Hispanic White Population comprised 75% or more of the population in the census tracts located in Suwanee, Sugar Hill, Buford, Dacula, Harbins, Grayson, Loganville, and Mountain Park areas. Census tracts located in Norcross and adjacent to DeKalb County had proportions as low as 16.5%.

Figure 17 depicts the absolute change from 1990 to 2000 in the county's non-Hispanic White proportion by 1990 census tract. **Figure 17** tells the story of a much more ethnically diverse Gwinnett County in 2000 than what was the extant in 1990. During the 1990s the non-Hispanic White population proportion decreased in all of Gwinnett County's census tracts. The largest decreases occurred in census tracts located in the Norcross, Peachtree Corners, Lilburn, and Stone Mountain areas adjacent to DeKalb and Fulton counties and in the I-85 corridor. Smaller decreases occurred in the tracts located in central Gwinnett including portions of Duluth, Lawrenceville, and Snellville. The non-Hispanic White population proportion decrease in Gwinnett since 1990 can be attributed to the

much larger growth rates of the county's minority population. In addition the non-Hispanic White population proportions have decreased in many census tracts located in southwest Gwinnett because of the actual loss of non-Hispanic White residents.


SUMMARY

The ethnic and racial composition of Gwinnett County's population underwent a dramatic transformation during the 1990s. One of the most visible signs of this change was the large increase in the county's minority population proportion. Attracted by employment opportunities, relatively affordable housing, and quality education services and facilities, Gwinnett County's minority population increased by 397% and by 2000, 31% of Gwinnett's total population was composed of minority groups.

While Blacks were Gwinnett County's largest minority group, the proportion of the Black population to the total minority population declined indicating that other minority populations were increasing at faster rates. Gwinnett's Hispanic population in particular experienced tremendous gains during the 1990s and by 2000 persons of Hispanic origin comprised the county's second largest minority group.

The increases in minority resident proportions during the 1990s indicate growing ethnic and racial diversity throughout Gwinnett County. Changes in the ethnic and racial composition of the county's population during the 2000s may continue to reflect the changes that occurred in the past decade.



1990-2000 Total Population Percent Change




1990-2000 Minority Population Net Change



Proportion Of Total Population




Figure 6 1990-2000 Black Population Net Change



2000 Black Population Proportion Of Total Population



Proportion Of Total Population



1990-2000 Hispanic Population Net Change



2000 Hispanic Population Proportion Of Total Population



Proportion Of Total Population



1990-2000 Asian/PI Population Net Change



2000 Asian Population Proportion Of Total Population



Proportion Of Total Population




Proportion Of Total Population




