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## COUNTY INSTALLS MORE CAMERAS TO MANAGE TRAFFIC CONGESTION

(Lawrenceville, Ga., Nov. 20, 2013) – Ten more miles of fiber-optic cables will connect traffic cameras and signals on Gravel Springs Road and Dacula Road to Gwinnett’s award-winning Traffic Control Center soon. The ComTran Group Inc. was the low bidder on two contracts awarded Tuesday by the Board of Commissioners. Both projects are funded by the 2009 SPLOST program.

The Gravel Springs Road/State Route 324 project will install 10 cameras and 5.7 miles of fiber-optic cable and provide connectivity to nine traffic signals along the corridor from State Route 20 to Dacula Road at a cost of \$702,484.

The second project will install six cameras with connections to nine signals and cable along 4.5 miles of Dacula Road from Winder Highway/State Route 8 to Auburn Road/State Route 324 at a cost of \$419,656.

District 4 Commissioner John Heard said, “This is another good example of using SPLOST funds to improve mobility. These projects will provide more real-time traffic monitoring and control in this growing area of the county.”

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
