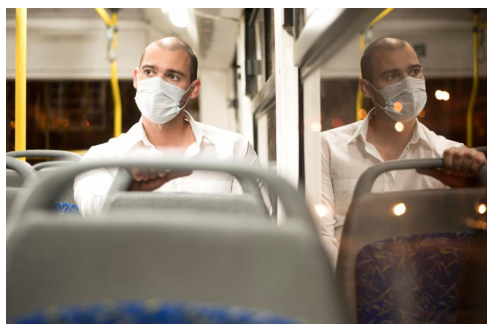
Paper tickets no longer accepted as fare payment

Face coverings required through March 18



While the [mandate](#) signed by Gwinnett County Chairwoman Nicole L. Hendrickson states that masks are no longer required in County facilities, GCT passengers are required to wear a face mask on all buses through **March 18, 2022**. This is in accordance with updated [TSA](#) and [FTA](#) guidance for travelers using public transit.
