No service on Independence Day



In observance of Independence Day, Gwinnett County Transit's local bus, commuter bus, and paratransit services will not operate on **Saturday, July 4**. We will run only local and paratransit services on **Friday, July 3**, and return to full operation on local, commuter, and paratransit services on **Monday, July 5**.

Half fare and paratransit ID cards available

Paratransit and half fare customers are now permitted to come into the Gwinnett County Transit Customer Service Office to receive their Breeze Card with ID photo. This service was temporarily suspended because of COVID-19. Breeze Cards with photo IDs may be presented to bus drivers for validation, and are used to pay paratransit fares and half fares.

Local buses limiting capacity to 15 passengers

To protect our bus drivers and patrons, Gwinnett County Transit is temporarily only allowing 15 passengers on local buses. Once a local bus reaches its 15-passenger capacity, it will display “Bus Full. Please wait for the next bus” until there is room on the bus.



Gwinnett BRT Study: tell us what you want to see

partnership with the Gateway85, Gwinnett Place and Sugarloaf Community Improvement Districts and the Atlanta Regional Commission – is embarking on an integrated land use and transportation plan for its first proposed Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) corridor.



Bus rapid transit is similar to rail-based transit services but uses rubber-tired vehicles to provide service to more people at a lower cost. Like rail, BRT moves people quickly and efficiently to and from their destinations, but is faster and cheaper to launch than heavy and light rail service.

The study will evaluate potential station locations, record stated preferences for surrounding development/redevelopment, and provide recommendations to make this vision a reality. These recommendations will be determined through technical analysis as well as by input from the community.

To support public engagement in the time of social distancing, the project team has created an interactive project website, GwinnettBRT.com, which features information about the study as well as a survey and a Map It! activity.
