Gwinnett County Commission creates Transit Review Committee

With Gwinnett County expected to continue rapid growth through 2040 and beyond, the need for a robust transit system become even more critical. The Board of Commissioners passed a [resolution](#) on September 3 creating the Gwinnett County Transit Review Committee, a group of 13 citizens, to advise them on how to expand transit in Gwinnett County.



The committee will conduct a thoughtful and thorough review of Gwinnett's transit needs and the options. The committee will present written recommendations to the Board by December 31. The committee was formed following a transit contract referendum in March in which voters did not approve a contract with MARTA to operate Gwinnett's transit system and a 38-year, one-percent sales tax to implement the [Connect Gwinnett: Transit Plan](#). The Connect Gwinnett: Transit Plan detailed significant, short- and long-term expansion of transit in Gwinnett, including using various types of transit, adding more routes, and identifying funding sources.

The committee may consider the transit plan, analyze transit needs, various types of transit,

and potential economic benefits and impacts. The committee will also consider options suggested by the public.

The Transit Review Committee will hold regular meetings, which are open to the public. Meeting notices, agendas, and minutes in the future will be available [here](#).

Bus stop changes on Technology Parkway

Some bus stops on Route 35 in Peachtree Corners have been removed or relocated to make room for self-driving cars. The city of Peachtree Corners has designated the outer right lane at Technology Parkway as an autonomous vehicle test track, which is part of the Curiosity Lab program. Transit tips & tricks

Did you know your bus driver needs at least 100 feet before your bus stop to stop the bus? As you approach your stop on the bus, make sure you pull the cord along the window on a local bus or push the button above you on a commuter bus beforehand so that the driver has enough time to safely



stop the vehicle. The LED display inside the bus will say "Stop Requested," and you will hear an automated announcement saying that your stop has been requested.
