

Gold Mine Park which sits along Level Creek Road and serves as a trail head to the Sugar Hill Greenway.



SUGAR HILL HISTORY AND GOLD MINE PARK



Panning for gold in the Sugar Hill area goes back to the early days of settlement following the creation of Gwinnett County in 1818 from lands acquired from the Creek and Cherokee Nations.

Searching for gold drew settlers to Sugar Hill and boosted community growth and development. From the 1800s to the mid 1900s there were several gold mines in operation in Sugar Hill, notably around Richland Creek and Level Creek Road.

Deposits of gold in this area are found in igneous and metamorphic rock marked by clear veins of quartz. Unlike dirt mines in the western Unlide States that are supported by wooden pillars, mines in Sugar Hill were carved into these quartz veins. Here you can see the opening of one of the mines once in operation in Sugar Hill.

In Sugar Hill, some streets are named after the city's gold mining history. Those streets include:

Gold Mine Drive Gold Nugget Way Simmons Mine Circle Gold Dust Trail

Edward and William Shelley were father and son. Both moved to the Level Creek area in the 1870s and began mining for James Simmons. William would later purchase a home and 249 acres near Level Creek in 1883. The Shelley Family would own gold mines up until about 1941, but stopped mining around 1913.



THE OLDEST SITE IN GWINNETT COUNTY. WAS A FORT IN THE WAR OF 1812 AND WAS CONSTRUCTED AS A REPLACEMENT OF A LATE 18TH TO EARLY 19TH CENTURY FRONTIER FORT AT THE HOG MOUNTAIN COMMUNITY.

THE SOCIETY ALSO OPERATES THE 19.2-ACRE HISTORICAL ELISHA WINN PROPERTY IN DACULA (BUILT ABOUT 1812), WHICH BECAME PART OF GWINNETT COUNTY ON DECEMBER 15. 1818, WHEN THE GEORGIA LEGISLATURE CREATED THE COUNTIES OF GWINNETT. WALTON, AND HALL.
