The Department of Finance provided a revenue update and the Departments of Support Services, Transportation, and Water Resources provided updates on their capital projects. No official action taken.














Alcohol Excise Tax








Title Ad Valorem Tax






North Chattahoochee Sewer Interceptor






Eastern Regional Infrastructure






Wayne Mason Water Intake Replacement Project






