




#### Cost of Housing

#### **Emerging Themes**

#### **Gwinnett Legislative Delegation**

Pre-Session Meeting Monday, December 13, 2021

Gwinnett County established a governing body of four District Commissioners with a countywide elected Chairperson in 1968. The Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners under this form of government is responsible for the legislative actions of the County and approves the work of the County's award-winning staff. The five Commissioner form of government is prevalent throughout the country and is used effectively in some of the most populous, most diverse, and most economically productive counties in the United States. Gwinnett County is currently recognized as one of these counties, and changes to the established form of government would cause interruptions that could possibly impact that high standing.

- Gwinnett County is the Gold Standard in county government in the State of Georgia.
  - o Gwinnett is one of five Georgia counties with a AAA Bond Rating (Cobb, Columbia, Fayette, Forsyth, and Gwinnett).
  - Four out of five of these counties have a governing structure of four District Commissioners and a Chairperson.
  - Gwinnett is one of 100 counties in the U.S. that have a AAA bond rating.
  - Of the top 10 most populous non-consolidated counties in the U.S., only one has more than five and they are not AAA rated.
  - o Of these counties, Gwinnett County is the smallest in land area.
  - Some notable counties with larger populations (all in the top 25 most populous counties) than
    Gwinnett that have five Commissioners and a AAA bond rating are:

•	Los Angeles County, CA (Los Angeles)	10.0 million
•	Harris County, TX (Houston)	4.7 million
•	Maricopa County, AZ (Phoenix)	4.4 million
•	San Diego County, CA (San Diego)	3.3 million
•	Dallas County, TX (Dallas)	2.6 million
•	Tarrant County, TX (Fort Worth)	2.1 million
•	Bexar County, TX (San Antonio)	2.0 million
•	Alameda County, CA (Oakland)	1.7 million

- Gwinnett County Government is an economic driver in the community.
  - Gwinnett County is the County's second largest employer at 5,700 employees.
  - The five Commissioner structure allows Gwinnett County to efficiently conduct the business of the County without subcommittees – allowing ordinances, permits, purchasing contracts, rezonings, and other necessary functions of local government to quickly move through the process, ensuring timely and reliable service delivery.
  - Additional commissioners would lead to subcommittees and additional bureaucracy ultimately interrupting the current efficiency of Gwinnett County and removing the responsibility of the Board of Commissioners to dig deep into important issues.
  - Additional commissioners would require added staff and appointments leading to added layers of government downstream from the Board of Commissioners.
