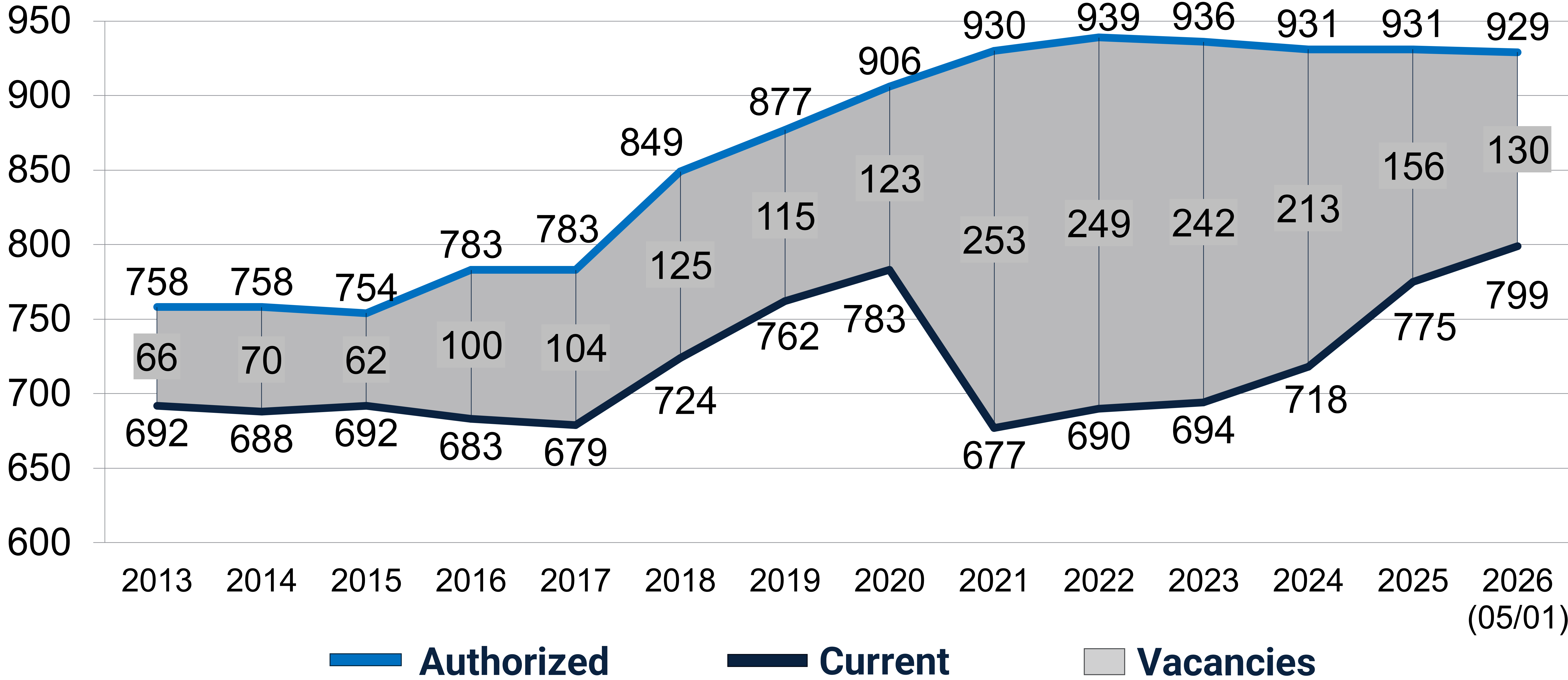

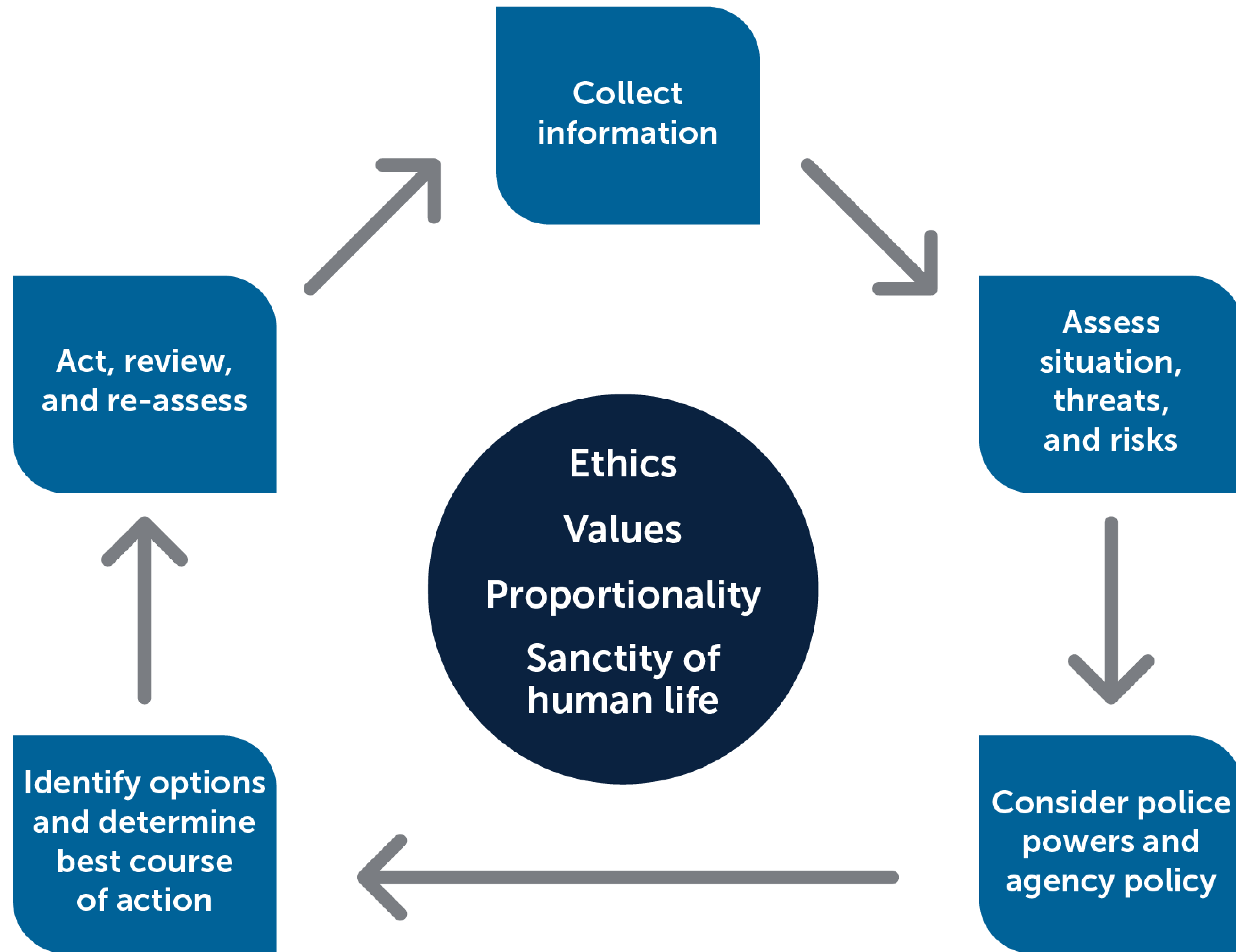

ICAT: Integrating Communications, Assessment, and Tactics

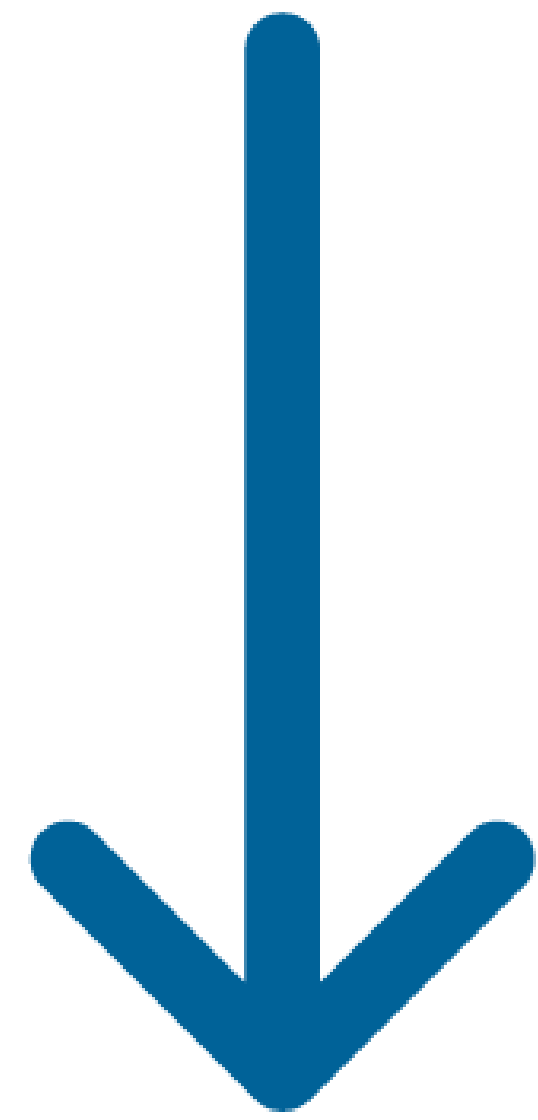
