Comments/update Sustainability Officer and Commissioner's updates Mendie White, Gwinnett County Sustainability Officer, mentioned that the Atlanta Regional Commission is developing a strategy for the electric vehicle "charging deserts". Rob Blatecky, Chairperson, encouraged GCSC members to communicate with the district commissioners to increase awareness of sustainability. Dr. Marshall Shepherd recommended a speaker to present on risk vulnerability and will attempt to have the speaker present during the GCSC meeting in April.


### **ABOUT SACE**

# Under the Gold Dome (206 Washington Street)

#### HB 1192 (Carson)

Pauses the data center tax exemption for 2-years to study energy impacts.

<u>SB 457 (Hufstetler)</u> Reinstates a Consumer Utility Counsel

#### HB 300 (Kelley)

Requires financial assurances for end-of-life solar decommissioning

#### HB 73 (Gullett)

Requires written disclosure statement and a Certificate of Authorization from the PSC for solar businesses to operate in Georgia

#### <u>HB 1312 (Jasperse)</u> → <u>HB 516</u>

Extends the effective date of EV taxation from Jan/1/2025 to Jan/1/2026
